

DISCLOSURE MATERIALS

- 2) Describe how the company has addressed this issue.
- 3) Demonstrate that management systems are in place to avoid similar issues from arising in the future.

Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

SUMMARY OF ISSUE	Rivanna Natural Designs Inc. manufactures award products, mostly from wood. Its raw materials are derived from domestic and tropical forests.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	90% of the company's revenue is derived from mostly wood-based products. The remaining 10% of revenue is derived from glass and recycled glass products.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	Global biodiversity loss from clear-cutting forests, illegal logging, and poor forest management. Wood product manufacturing within and outside the the awards industry have significant potential impact on biodiversity loss.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	"The company has taken many steps to manage its impacts on biodiversity. It has chosen Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) certification for its products as FSC is generally considered to be the gold standard in responsible forestry, It also partners with NGOs such as the World Wildlife Fund (WWF) to hold itself accountable for monitoring and managing the impacts of forestry and what it considers to be well-managed forestry on biodiversity. The company recognises that there is still a great deal that the scientific community does not understand about the conservation impacts of forest management and expects to learn more over time. It does not have any specific targets related to preserving or conserving biodiversity. Its targets are instead focused on designing and manufacturing products with materials and best practices that it believes best protects biodiversity: FSC certified woods, mostly domestic, low or no VOC finishes, no epoxies, no plastics, recyclability, ease of post-use disassembly into technical and natural waste streams."
