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Disclosure Materials

Background checks include a review of public records, news sources, and search engines for company names, brands, executives/founders, and other relevant topics.

Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

B Lab's Public Complaints Process

Any party may submit a complaint about a current B Corp through B Lab's Public Complaint Process. Grounds for complaint include:

- Intentional misrepresentation of practices, policies, and/or claimed outcomes during the company's certification process
- 2) Breaches of the B Corp Community's core values as expressed in our Declaration of Interdependence

Topic	Clients in Controversial Industries
Summary of Issue	Forward Global designs and delivers services and technologies to manage digital, economic, and information risks to clients in controversial industries such mining, fossil-fuels, for-profit education, pharmaceutical, gambling, nuclear power and water utilities.
	Services provided to the controversial clients listed above, includes:
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the fiscal year of 2022, an estimated total of 3.11% of revenue was generated through the clients in controversial industries.
Impact on Stakeholders	Companies that work with clients in controversial industries can indirectly increase the harmful impact to stakeholders by enabling business growth. Therefore, companies that work with clients in these industries should have practices in place to ensure that their impact is aimed at decreasing the negative impacts of the industry. B Lab has flagged the involvement of companies with clients in
	controversial industries as a material issue and new standards will be created to address possible risks related to this matter.
Implemented Management Practices	Forward Global has processes in place to ensure clients are in compliance with the company's Ethics Charter and Ethical Code of Conduct. The Ethical Charter provides guidance to the company in enforcing compliance with a framework that extends beyond legal obligations.
	Forward Global has adopted a procedure called "Compliance & Integrity Check" to assess the ethical and legal soundness of



the various third parties it interacts with, including clients. As such, clients will be subjected to more-or-less-thorough audits depending on their risk profile, which is assessed according to a set of objective criteria combined with a risk weighting system.

Several factors are taken into account when evaluating the risks of each potential client, including: the industry in which they operate, country and/region of operations, services proposed by Forward Group.

For clients in sensitive sectors or other clients for which Forward Global's internal risk matrix identified to be in the "medium" or "high risk" category, additional due diligence is conducted by the compliance department. Particularly sensitive cases are referred to Forward Global's Ethics Committee, composed of four independent members who would assess and provide the final guidance.

If the Ethics Committee agrees to a particular proposal/client, albeit they may do so under certain conditions and with restrictions attached, the managers or partners can proceed with the proposed collaboration. If the Ethics Committee rejects a potential client, the business opportunity will be abandoned. Employees of Forward Global can also report a business opportunity to the Ethics Committee, either before the signing of a contract or at the time of its contractual execution, if they believe the client does not respect our Ethical Code of Conduct. The representative appointed by Forward Global's investment fund, Raise, as well as Partners globally, may also refer a case to the Ethics Committee. Forward Global provides guidance and details for reporting any misconduct/unethical/illegal practices in its website under the Whistleblower Hotline available on its website.

Management Comments

In the past two years, Forward Global has put an end to providing reputation management and certain online advocacy services (particularly for high risk and controversial clients) and also begun to reduce the percentage of revenues for its clients in certain potentially sensitive sectors, including fossil fuels in relation to the winding down of these activities.



Forward Global's anti-corruption code of conduct outlines both the legally prohibited behaviors, and the practices forbidden by the Group. This code identifies high-risk situations, prescribes the appropriate conduct, and specifies the repercussions for code violations. This commitment reflects the company's stance on promoting an integrity-driven culture based on zero tolerance for corruption in all its forms.
