

DISCLOSURE MATERIALS

Certified B Corporations must complete a Disclosure Questionnaire to identify potentially sensitive issues related to the company (e.g. historical fines, sanctions, material litigation, or sensitive industry practices).

This component does not affect the company's score on the B Impact Assessment. If the company answers affirmatively to any items in the Disclosure Questionnaire and B Lab deems them to be material, the company must:

- 1) Be transparent about the disclosure issues identified on the company's public B Impact Report
- 2) Describe how the company has addressed this issue.
- 3) Demonstrate that management systems are in place to avoid similar issues from arising in the future.

In all cases, the Standards Advisory council reserves the right to refuse certification if the company is ultimately deemed not to uphold the spirit of the community.

In addition to the voluntary indication of sensitive issues in the Disclosure Questionnaire, companies pursuing Certification also are subject to background checks by B Lab staff. Background checks include a review of public records, news sources, and search engines for company names, brands, executives/founders, and other relevant topics.

Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

ISSUE DATE	Dec-21
TOPIC	Significant layoffs due to COVID-19
SUMMARY OF ISSUE	Significant layoffs due to loss of income and projects for the COVID-19 Pandemic. MOB is a communication, PR, and Marketing BTL agency, and their services are hired by other companies on specific projects, given the ongoing pandemic several projects got canceled therefore the company had to prescind the services of 4 collaborators.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	4 employees were laid off, representing 36.36% of the company's employees at that time.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	Primary impact was loss of employment for affected employees.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	The company tracked the current activities of the laid-off employees, currently, all of them have regained work in different jobs, and 2 of them have begun their own businesses. For 2 workers that were under the company's payroll the company paid their severance pay for justified dismissal under the obligation of the Colombian Law, given that 2 of the laid-off workers are contractors that worked more than 6 months and +20 hours per week, they are included in this analysis, and because of the naturality of not being dependent of the company, the company did not implement management practices. The loss of projects made it impossible for the company to sustain so many workers.
RELATED INCIDENTS (YES/NO)	*5 people were laid-off each on different months, from August to December 2021. *3 people were laid off from February 2020- July 2020 because of the COVID-19 pandemic and the loss of projects
