Company Name: Evian Resort

Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Alcohol

Topic	Company serves and sells alcohol products
Summary of Issue	Evian Resort has several points of sale including restaurants and bars which allow the sale and consumption of alcohol for their guests. The company earns a material amount of revenue from the sale of alcohol.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the previous fiscal year (2022), alcohol sales represented less than 0,05% of sales of the entities in scope of certification.
Impact on Stakeholders	Alcohol may have a negative impact on the health and well-being of individuals and their communities. There are also risks related to irresponsible sales of alcoholic beverages (e.g. overserving) and serving or marketing alcoholic products to minors.
Management Practices	The company reported the following measures to reduce risks associated with the sale of alcohol: - The sale of alcohol complies with the French legislation, - All bartenders are fully trained and have a diploma to serve alcohol and cocktails. The company does daily reminders of best practices on serving alcohol during their briefings, - Evian Resort has a policy in place that requires the staff to check the ID of every young adult. The policy also indicates best practices for employees on how to avoid over-serving situations.

Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Disclosure Tobacco

Topic	Company earned revenue from the sale of tobacco
Summary of Issue	Evian Resort has a range of activities including casino, golf and spa hotels. Evian Resort has two points of sale in restaurants and bars which allow the sale of tobacco to their guests/clients only. While Evian Resort itself is not eligible for B Corp Certification and is not able to make use of the B Corp IP, the company is required to disclose the risks and share their practices to manage potential negative impacts associated with the sale of tobacco-related products.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the previous fiscal year (2022), tobacco sales to guests/clients represented less than 0,001% of sales of the entities in scope of certification.
Impact on Stakeholders	Tobacco products pose a negative risk to local communitys' well-being and health.
Management Practices	- The company follows <u>legislation</u> in place that bans smoking in bars and restaurants, - Smoking is prohibited in public places including workplaces. There are authorized and adapted areas available for smoking.



Company Name: Société Anonyme des Eaux Minérales d'Evian (SAEME) Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Operations in sensitive ecosystems

Topic	Company extracts water from sensitive ecosystems
Summary of Issue	The source of evian® natural mineral water comes from the heart of the French Alps, a unique geological site in the world. Its catchment area is recognised as a wetland by the RAMSAR convention and a protected site. Wetlands included in the List acquire a new status at the national level and are recognized by the international community as being of significant value not only for the country, or the countries, in which they are located, but for humanity as a whole. The Convention establishes on Article 2.2. that "wetlands should be selected for the List on account of their international significance in terms of ecology, botany, zoology, limnology or hydrology."
	SAEME does not own the water sources used for producing evian® natural mineral water but is responsible for the water extraction and preservation operations in the area.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	The company's bottling site is not located in this sensitive ecosystem. It is located in the proximity of Evian's water sources.
Impact on Stakeholders	Having facilities/operations near protected/sensitive ecosystems can potentially impact the flora, fauna and quality of the ecosystem (e.g. noise & light pollution from the facilities, spills, air / soil / water pollution owing to the company's operations).
Management Practices	- Société Anonyme des Eaux Minérales d'Evian abides by the obligations highlighted on the governmental order (Arrêté Préfectoral) on how to protect the sensitive ecosystems in which they operate, - The company has an association, L'Association pour la Protection de l'Impluvium de l'Eau Minérale Evian (APIEME) designed to preserve the environment and water resources of evian natural mineral water. This association is the result of a public-private partnership between the Evian water company and the 13 municipalities concerned by the Evian water resource. The actions are focused around 3 key objectives: maintaining sustainable and environmentally friendly agriculture (for example, with the development of regenerative agriculture), preserving natural environments (for example, with the BeeOmonitoring program to monitor the state of the environment), and supporting reasoned territorial development (for example, the zero pesticide program or environmentally friendly snow removal).

Company Name: Volvic

Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Operations in sensitive ecosystems

Topic	Company extracts water from sensitive ecosystems
Summary of Issue	Volvic® natural mineral water comes from Auvergne, a region in France known for its volcanic geology with the <u>Chaine de Puys - Limagne Fault</u> that is recorded in the 2018 <u>UNESCO World Heritage Natural list</u> .
	Volvic does not own the water sources used for producing Volvic® natural mineral water but is responsible for the water extraction operations in the area.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	The company's bottling sites are not located in this sensitive ecosystem. They are located in the proximity of Volvic's water sources.
Impact on Stakeholders	Having facilities/operations near protected/sensitive ecosystems can potentially impact the flora, fauna and quality of the ecosystem (e.g. noise & light pollution from the facilities, spills, air / soil / water pollution owing to the company's operations).
	The company shared that the company's facilities are located at 4 km below the impluvium, therefore the potential impact on the ecosystem of the source is limited.
Management Practices	Volvic has put in place a full plan to ensure sustainable and responsible management of the water source and preserve natural environment and biodiversity through: (1) An expert team of hydrogeologists: In order for the water source to continue to renew itself at the pace of its natural mineral water cycle, Volvic ensures sustainable and responsible management, led by its expert team of hydrogeologists. In the large chain of the natural mineral water cycle, hydrogeologists are a major link in ensuring that the resource is conserved quantitatively and protected qualitatively, (2) The creation and run of projects through the CEPIV: Co-created by Société des Eaux de Volvic in 2006, the environmental committee for the protection of the Volvic impluvium (CEPIV) is a public-private partnership with the 4 local communities of the catchment area. Its mission is to implement actions with all territory stakeholders that reconcile local development and the protection of the catchment area and its biodiversity. The mission of CEPIV focuses on three areas: Preserve the natural environment and biodiversity; develop environmentally friendly agricultural practices and promote the careful planning and management of villages, roads and railways. For example, it supports local farmers in implementing sustainable agricultural practices with technical and financial assistance to farmers in the source area to convert to organic farming practices, (3) Partnerships to protect birds and flora: Through three long standing local partnerships, Volvic has being engaged to preserve biodiversity with specialized organizations, such as the conservatory of natural areas of auvergne (CEN auvergne) to protect the Alcon blue butterfly, Beeodiversity to assess the environmental quality of the fauna and flora of the area and the French league for the Protection of Birds (LPO) to protect the Red kite (Milan Royal) bird.
