Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the last fiscal year, 40% of the company's annual revenue was from clients in the mining industry.
Impact on Stakeholder(s)	Companies that work with clients in controversial industries can directly or indirectly increase the harmful impact to stakeholders by enabling business growth. Therefore, companies that work with clients in these industries should have practices in place to ensure that their impact is aimed at decreasing the negative impacts of the industry.
	Companies offering certain types of services and products to controversial clients are required to have at minimum a grievance/complaints mechanism and a whistleblower protection policy.
Implemented Management Practices	#SustainablePublicAffairs has the following mechanisms in place to manage the risks associated to serving clients in the mining industry:
	Grievance/complaints mechanism . This is accessible to the public through their webpage or via email submitted to info@sustainablepublicaffairs.com. In case employees would like to do anonymous reporting, the company also has a dedicated box in their office where reporting can be made. The company establishes that the criteria to accept and investigate a complaint is the violation of/non-compliance with their sustainability charter or D&I charter. All whistleblowers shall receive a report within five business days of the initial report, regarding the investigation, disposition or resolution of the

	issue.
	 Whistleblower Protection Policy. The policy includes the following statements: The Whistleblower shall receive no retaliation or retribution for a report that was provided in good faith – that was not done primarily with malice to damage another or the organization. Anyone who retaliates against the Whistleblower (who reported an event in good faith) will be subject to discipline, including termination of C-suite or employee status. Supervisors, managers, and/or C-suite members who receive the reports must immediately act to investigate and/or resolve the issue. The Whistleblower shall receive a report within five business days of the initial report, regarding the investigation, disposition or resolution of the issue. If the investigation of a report, that was done in good faith and investigated by internal personnel, is not to the Whistleblower's satisfaction, then he/she has the right to report the event to the appropriate legal or investigating agency. The identity of the Whistleblower, if known, shall remain confidential to those persons directly involved in applying this policy, unless the issue requires investigation by law enforcement, in which case members of the organization are subject to subpoena. In case employees would like to do anonymous reporting, the company has a dedicated box in the office where reporting can be made.
