Summary of Issue	ecologyst outfitters inc. manufactures and sells apparel and, as an apparel manufacturer, operates in an energy intensive industry.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	100% of the company's revenue is earned from the manufacturing and selling of apparel.
Impact on Stakeholders	Textile manufacturing is a major contributor to global carbon emissions.
Implemented Management Practices	 ecologyst outfitters' primary contributors to its carbon footprint are as a result of shipping products to customers, air travel required for visiting/auditing supplier factories and per-product impacts from the company's supply chain. To mitigate impact, the company offsets all emissions from shipping to customers through a collaboration with Pachama. In the company's facilities, ecologyst outfitters has energy efficient appliances, lighting, and waste collection/diversion services for cardboard, plastics, and organics. Additionally, the company recycles textile offcuts created in its facilities. ecologyst outfitters have specific targets in relation to annual emissions as well as an overall target to align with Sustainable Development Goals to reduce company's emissions by 35-45% by 2030; a step indicated as necessary by the UN for the fashion industry. To avoid the impact of using virgin materials, the company is currently in the research phase for solutions in regenerated fibers and recycled content fabrics. The company's per-product absolute carbon footprint ranges from 11.5kg CO2 for an organic heavyweight cotton t-shirt to 59.5kg CO2 for a wool puffy jacket, which is predominantly dependent on the material breakdown (cotton or wool). These

	products are offered with a lifetime guarantee and repairs for life. Company is also launching a second life program where customers will be able to shop pre-owned ecologyst garments, significantly reducing the per-product impact by approximately 80%, which was launched to the public on October 13th, 2021.
	ecologyst outfitters also have a commitment to perform an annual assessment with their partner Synergy Enterprises to provide progress over time in comparison to organizations of similar size and type and also including offsetting unavoidable emissions.

Other Management Comments	Company has a commitment to source from local suppliers that have certifications for their sustainable practices, therefore decreasing the carbon footprint of their products.
	ecologyst donates textile offcuts from their manufacturing process to local craft and art organizations, while also providing recommendations on shipping methods to reduce their emissions.
	Customers have the possibility to shop directly from their factory, avoiding emissions related to transporting the products to shops or shipping. Ecologyst has also partnered with Carbon Neutral Club which is a third party provider that enables individuals to calculate and offset their emissions while getting access to sustainable brands at a lower rate rewarding them for taking personal responsibility for their impact. This is a pending B Corp as well.
	Products with some small quality issues are not landfilled, but are sold with discounts and repairs for life are also provided, reducing the emissions of a product to around 20-30%.

Summary of Issue	Ecologyst Outfitters manufactures and sells apparel and, as an apparel manufacturer, operates in water intensive industry.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	100% of company's revenue is earned from the manufacturing and selling of apparel.
Impact on Stakeholders	As a water intensive industry, the clothing manufacturing poses risks such as water stress or depletion of local water sources if water use is not appropriately managed.
Implemented Management Practices	The company has calculated its water intensity per product. The heavyweight standard organic cotton t-shirt requires 13,000 liters of water for manufacturing and home laundering care combined. If only manufacturing is considered, this number would reduce to 11,560 liters. For the Merino Jersey t-shirt, 2,140 liters of water are required to produce a home launder. For an item such as the Merino Bubble Knit Sweater, 3,590 liters of water are required. The company is currently looking to reduce this number with the launching of the second life program, as well as develop new products with recycled/regenerated materials.

Summary of Issue	ecologyst outfitters inc. previously purchased cotton from a textile company that sourced cotton from China. 20% of global cotton comes from Xinjiang Uyghur Autonomous Region, (Uyghur Region), or produced by certain entities implicated in forced labour.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	At the time 2.5% of supplier expenses were on cotton sourced from China
Impact on Stakeholders	The use of cotton poses a human rights risk due to the possibility that they are sourced from conflict-affected and high risk areas, where they may be used to finance conflict and/or be associated with human rights abuses in the supply chain.
Resolution	The last time ecologyst outfitters inc. purchased cotton sourced from China was in 2020. The company does not use this fabric anymore and have since replaced it with a different fabric with raw materials sourced from India.
	The cotton previously sourced from China was GOTS certified organic cotton.
