Topic	Company sources precious metals, stones and diamonds
Summary of Issue	LYLIE Jewellery Ltd is based in the UK and buys precious metals, stones and diamonds to develop their jewellery.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	 - 100% of the company's annual revenue comes from the sale of jewellery, - 95% of the precious metals (gold, silver or platinum) used as raw material come from recycled sources from the company's Gold Exchange Initiative in the UK. The other 5% are sourced from traditional suppliers.
Impact on Stakeholders	The use of precious metals and gemstones poses a human rights risk due to the possibility that they are sourced from conflict-affected and high-risk areas, where they may be used to finance conflict and/or be associated with human rights abuses in the supply chain.
	B Lab has flagged the jewelry industry as a material issue and new standards will be created to address possible risks related to this matter. Should the Standards Advisory Council determine specific performance requirements for companies in this industry, Nabs and Babs would be required to meet these standards by a future recertification date.
Implemented Management Practices	- The company has established a Supplier Code of Conduct, to which all current suppliers are committed to adhering. This code defines best practices fair, safe, and healthy working conditions, and environmental responsibility throughout the company's supply chain, which means it is applicable to direct and indirect suppliers and contractors. The Code addresses the following topics: 1) Law and Code Compliance, 2) Child Labour, 3) Forced Labour, 4) Harassment, Abuse and Disciplinary Practices, 5) Discrimination, 6) Freedom Of Association and Collective Bargaining, 7) Employment Relationship, 8) Wages And Benefits, 9) Overtime Wages, 10) Hours of Work, 11) Health And Safety, 12) Environment, 13) Community, 14) Subcontracting and 15) Traceability, - LYLIE has circularity practices in the production process: The company receives gold, silver, and platinum through its Gold Exchange Initiative in which people give their unwanted



platinum, gold or silver to LYLIE in exchange for a credit note priced at 7.5% above the gold scrap value of their old metals to incentivise their recycling. All the metal received is recycled by the company,

- The precious stones are sourced based on the criteria from the <u>Gemomlogical Certification Services</u>, which indicates the geographical origin of the materials. According to the company, the company's Director was trained by the <u>Gemological Institute of America</u>. All gems going forward are being sourced from unset antique jewellery (recycled from pre-loved items) first and foremost. Any new natural gems are sourced from those who have passed LYLIE Jewellery due diligence checks,
- The diamonds used by the company are recycled or lab-grown,
- Some of the company's suppliers have certifications in place, however, this is not a requirement from LYLIE when hiring a supplier. In terms of due dilligence, the company conducts a case by case review of the supplier practices, requires their signature of the Supplier Code of Conduct and, after their agreement is signed, the company conducts frequent visits in the majority of their suppliers (75% of them were visited in the last fiscal year),
- The company does not have a formal Supplier policy for Conflict Minerals. LYLIE ask their mineral suppliers the country of origin of the raw material. If the supplier is unable to provide the information on the source of the minerals, the company not purchase the material from that specific supplier.
