SUMMARY OF ISSUE	<ul> <li>Over the past five years, FRUTICOLA OLMUE S.P.A. has received six penalties related to labor issues.</li> <li>Mar 2021: 30,00 UTM Not providing workers, free of charge, with the necessary personal protection equipment for their respective role.</li> <li>May 2021. Failure to report to the respective Administrative Body, (the accident/ illness that may cause incapacity for work or death).</li> <li>May 2021: Failure to execute an employment contract.</li> <li>Sept 2021: Work contracts not registered to the respective labor inspectorate of work services provided by minors below 18 years of age.</li> <li>Feb, 2019, May 2021 not providing showers with cold and hot water.</li> </ul>

IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	The legal protection of workers as well as the health and safety of workers were affected. None of the employees use the showers in the changing rooms, therefore no workers were impacted.
RESOLUTION	All penalties have been paid.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	All required physical implementation measures have been taken. In addition to strengthening the work, review and supervision programs in the case of administrative sanctioning processes.  The company does not have a formal communication with regards to these sanctions, but this type of information under Chilean legislation is public.

TOPIC	Biodiversity/Monoculture Impact
SUMMARY OF ISSUE	As an exporter of frozen fruits and vegetables (such as berries and asparagus), Frutícola Olmué operates in an industry in which biodiversity impact is a material environmental issue.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Approximately 94% of Frutícola Olmué's supplier expenses come directly from farms.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	Agriculture poses a risk to local ecosystems of flora and fauna as well as the potential degradation of cultivated land.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	Frutícola Olmué has an environmental policy that is shared with their producers. This policy establishes that the associated producers must protect the environment; implement good practices related to the consumption of water, energy, and waste management; promote the use of low-impact agrochemicals; and aim at minimizing soil intervention that can result in erosion.  Amongst producers, crop rotation is carried out only by strawberries' productors. Other crops such as raspberry, blackberry, blueberry, among others, are long-lasting (more than 5 years), allowing the producer to maintain the crops.  Frutícola Olmué provides their suppliers with a recommendation list which has organic alternatives or pesticides with lower-risk or lower-preharvest interval.  Besides that, Frutícola Olmué's agricultural team visits the producers and checks their agrochemical warehouses to verify that they are not storing and/or using chemicals that are not allowed or are harmful to people or the environment. In addition, when the product arrives at the production plant, samples are taken, and a multi-residue analisis is carried out to verify that the product is free of pesticides (in case of organics) or to identify that agrochemicals used are within the standard of the destination countries.

TOPIC	Energy and Emissions Intensive Industries
SUMMARY OF ISSUE	As an exporter of frozen fruits and vegetables (such as berries and asparagus), Frutícola Olmué operates in an industry in which energy and carbon emissions is a material environmental issue. Company claims that their main contribution to emissions comes from imported energy and scope 3 associated with transport, since their facilities are low-intense in energy use and emissions
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Approximately 94% of Frutícola Olmué's supplier expenses come directly from farms.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	Agriculture as well as food manufacturing and distribution are major contributors to global carbon emissions.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	Frutícula Olmué uses renewable energy sources (wind power) in their operations and has implemented an energy reduction project in its production plants.  For example, in the Chillán Viejo plant, light bulbs were replaced by LED technology and implemented temperature control in the chambers, to avoid condensation. In the Parral plant, one more condenser was added to the refrigeration system. These projects allowed the company to obtain GHG reduction recognition from the Chile Footprint Program of the Ministry of the Environment.

TOPIC	Water Intensive Industries
SUMMARY OF ISSUE	As an exporter of frozen fruits and vegetables (such as berries and asparagus), Frutícola Olmué operates in an water intensive industry. Water is used internally, for instance, to wash fruits/ vegetables and is also a resource used by fruit and vegetables growers in their supply chain.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Approximately 94% of Frutícola Olmué's supplier expenses come directly from farms.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	As a water intensive industry, agriculture poses risks such as water stress or depletion of local water sources if water use is not appropriately managed.  Frutícola Olmué's main operations are in the city of Chillan in Chile. Company claims that this is not a water stressed area and that they do not have producers in "water scarce" declared areas. They use well water in the production processes.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	Frutícola Olmue's manages a water indicator (water per ton processed) for their operations. However, company does not establish specific goals or objectives to reduce the use of water in its supply chain. In order to minimize water use and encourage best practices in their supply chain, Frutícula Olmué's agriculture team advises and guides agricultural suppliers regarding the most efficient types of irrigation that they can implement and where to apply for government subsidies. Company's challenge is that their producers can evolve in this matter - from furrow irrigation (that has an efficiency level of 60% to 70%) to drip irrigation that has an efficiency percentage of over 90%.
