The state governments where we operate mandated the shut-down of our business for 2 months during 2020, ceasing revenue and imperiling SunCommon's very survival. We furloughed our employees, sending them to federally-boosted unemployment benefits while maintaining their employer-paid benefits. As we envisioned re-opening, the marketplace had dramatically changed. The innovative community organizing model of marketing that we'd pioneered was literally rendered illegal, as gatherings of people were prohibited. So the jobs of our community organizers evaporated. Of the 28 employees we painfully laid off, half came from Marketing. And due to the steep economic downturn broadly, we forecast a 30% reduction in demand for the rest of our year. As personnel represents 80% of our business spending, others were laid off to match the slashed revenues. Our revised forecast envisions zero profit for the year; we hope to crawl back to break even. This first-ever layoff for us was horrible, but we believe we'll survive to fight another day...
