The most important environmental issue for Dopper is the amount of single use plastic being used for disposable water bottles, as this is directly related to the the company mission and business model. Therefore we have quantified the total amount of avoided single use plastic as a result of sold Dopper bottles. This is measured by taking the input of the Dopper impact research ("acquiring a new Dopper bottle avoids the purchase of 104 single use plastic water bottles per year") and projecting this on the yearly sales quantities. Clean water has been at the core of Dopper since day one. Both in our oceans and from the tap. You see, Merijn Everaarts founded Dopper back in 2009 to tackle plastic pollution in our oceans. But he realised a reusable water bottle to drink tap water from isn't much help if you're one in four people around the world who don't have a tap with safe drinking water running from it. And so investing in safe drinking water projects in Nepal has been part of our work from the start. We partner with Dutch NGO Simavi and Kathmandu-based social enterprise SmartPaani. Together with Simavi, we worked with their local partners on the ground in Nepal to bring water and education to some of the most remote areas of Nepal. Currently, we are working on a highly innovative project, trying to change a whole system and provide a municipality (almost 60.000 people) with access to clean drinking water, straight from the tap, for the long run. This means that we are involving the people, the local government and local businesses. They have to create an overarching system that lasts. If this projects turns out the be a success, it will provide a blue print for the rest of Nepal. Our work with SmartPaani impacts lower- and middle-class Nepalis around the country – both in rural and urban areas. SmartPaani itself exists of experienced technicians, researchers and businesspeople who together strive to tackle any (drinking) water problems the country faces. We do not only invest financially – for example in installations that capture and filter rain- or groundwater at schools – but are also involved with the development and marketing of products like an affordable water filter and a new 'Water Filter as a Service' model.
