Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

B Lab's Public Complaints Process

Any party may submit a complaint about a current B Corp through B Lab's Public Complaint Process. Grounds for complaint include:

- Intentional misrepresentation of practices, policies, and/or claimed outcomes during the company's certification process
- 2) Breaches of the B Corp Community's core values as expressed in our Declaration of Interdependence

Summary of Issue	First Ascent Group is a UK based training company that has served clients operating in the Animal Products and Services, Alcohol, Pharmaceuticals, Whole Life Insurance Products, Nuclear Power or Hazardous Materials and Prisons industries. Services to these clients have included leadership, management and team development programs and training for staff, Emergenetics workshops and accreditations, as well as early careers development support to new employees. Services offered to these clients can be sold to clients in both controversial as well as non-controversial industries.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	 Clients in Controversial Industries represented the following % of the company's FY2023 revenue: Clients operating in the Animal Products and Services industry- 0.42% Clients operating in the Alcohol Industry-0.96% Clients operating in the Pharmaceuticals industry 0.13%. Clients operating in the Whole Life Insurance Industry-0.46%. Clients operating in the Nuclear Power or Hazardous Materials industry-4.97%. Clients operating in the Prison Industry 0%. Engagement with this industry ended in 2021.
Impact on Stakeholders	Companies that work with clients in controversial industries can indirectly increase the harmful impact to stakeholders by enabling business growth. Therefore, companies that work with clients in these industries should have practices in place to ensure that their impact is aimed at decreasing the negative impacts of the industry. B Lab has flagged the involvement of companies with clients in controversial industries as a material issue and new standards will be created to address possible risks related to this matter.
Implemented Management Practices	First Ascent Group claims to only work with clients who seek to improve their ethical leadership and operational impact. For



clients in controversial industries, the company ensures their clients are aligned with their objectives and work with leaders to ensure their leadership approach is focused on ethical, responsible practices and cultural development.

Prior to taking on a new client, First Ascent Group conducts research into their business and assesses whether they present a risk to the company's Code of Ethics and Practice Policy. Any clients considered to represent a potential risk are discussed at a Board Meeting prior to entering into contract with them.

The First Ascent Group Code of Conduct and Ethical behaviours policies apply to all employees, associates, clients, suppliers and partners and includes:

- An Anti-Bribery and Corruption policy;
- Anti Money Laundering policy;
- A recognition of the importance of fostering environmental awareness and adopting sustainable practices;
- A Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) commitment at a local, national and international level;
- A Conflict of Interest policy;
- An Anti-slavery and human trafficking policy.
