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Disclosure Materials

Any party may submit a complaint about a current B Corp through B Lab's Public Complaint Process. Grounds for complaint include:

- Intentional misrepresentation of practices, policies, and/or claimed outcomes during the company's certification process
- 2) Breaches of the B Corp Community's core values as expressed in our Declaration of Interdependence

Summary of Issue	WellWo Technologic SL has clients in the following industries: Fossil Fuels, Pharmaceuticals, and Tobacco.	
	WellWo provides a Digital Corporate Wellbeing Platform, which are services to support the motivation and wellbeing of employees.	
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the last fiscal year, 4.8% of the company's annual revenue was from clients in Pharmaceuticals, 3.98% from Fossil Fuels, and 0.5% from Tobacco.	
Impact on Stakeholders	Companies that work with clients in controversial industries can directly or indirectly increase the harmful impact to stakeholders by enabling business growth. Therefore, companies that work with clients in these industries should have practices in place to ensure that their impact is aimed at decreasing the negative impacts of the industry.	
	Companies offering certain types of services and products to controversial clients are required to have, at minimum, a grievance/complaints mechanism and a whistleblower protection policy.	
Implemented Management Practices	WellWo Technologic SL has the following mechanisms in place to manage the risks related to their business relationship with clients in controversial and ineligible industries:	
	Grievance/complaints mechanism. This is accessible to the public through the company's website. In the public complaints channel, the company shares the following information: • Requirements for Accepting a Grievance: Verifiable relationship with the company. The presenter must demonstrate a direct relationship with the company, either as an employee, customer, supplier, or other formal interaction.	



- The information must be clear and complete, including the filer's details and the details of the complaint.
- II. If applicable, attach relevant documentation to support the facts described.
- III. The complaint must be filed within a reasonable time after the event or incident, preferably no more than 30 days.
- Process Steps, Deadlines, and Final Deadline (Timeline):
 - I. Receipt of the complaint: Receipt of the complaint will be confirmed within 72 business hours after it is filed.
 - II. Initial assessment: Within 10 business days, the team will review the complaint to determine its validity and request additional information if necessary.
 - III. Research: If the complaint is accepted, an investigation process will be initiated that could take between 15 and 20 business days, depending on the complexity of the case.
 - IV. Resolution: Upon completion of the investigation, a resolution will be issued within 30 business days of the initial receipt of the complaint.
 - V. Communication of the resolution: The resolution will be communicated to the presenter via email or telephone call as indicated in the contact information provided.

Whistleblower Protection Policy. The policy includes the following statements:

- Right to confidentiality and protection of identity:
 Anyone who submits a communication or makes a public complaint has the right to have his or her identity not revealed to third parties, except for the exceptions provided by law.
- Right to information: The whistleblower will be notified of receipt of his or her complaint within 72 business hours.
 Within a maximum period of 10 business days, the team will review the complaint to determine its validity and request additional information if necessary. From this point on, the whistleblower will be kept informed of the process and any action that must be taken.



	 Prohibition of retaliation: WellWo expressly prohibits any type of retaliation (including threats and attempts at retaliation) against persons who file a complaint through the Complaints Mechanism or Complaints Channel in accordance with Law 2/2023, internal regulations, and this Policy. In the event of any retaliation, the Company will take appropriate measures and provide the Reporter with the necessary support to restore his or her rights and repair any damage suffered.
