

DISCLOSURE MATERIALS

Certified B Corporations must complete a Disclosure Questionnaire to identify potentially sensitive issues related to the company (e.g. historical fines, sanctions, material litigation, or sensitive industry practices).

This component does not affect the company's score on the B Impact Assessment. If the company answers affirmatively to any items in the Disclosure Questionnaire and B Lab deems them to be material, the company must:

- 1) Be transparent about the disclosure issues identified on the company's public B Impact Report
- 2) Describe how the company has addressed this issue.
- 3) Demonstrate that management systems are in place to avoid similar issues from arising in the future.

In all cases, the Standards Advisory council reserves the right to refuse certification if the company is ultimately deemed not to uphold the spirit of the community.

In addition to the voluntary indication of sensitive issues in the Disclosure Questionnaire, companies pursuing Certification also are subject to background checks by B Lab staff. Background checks include a review of public records, news sources, and search engines for company names, brands, executives/founders, and other relevant topics.

Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

TOPIC	Significant layoffs due to company needs
SUMMARY OF ISSUE	On May 30, 2020 the company laid off 2 employees because of the company's needs.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	On May 2020, LPG had three workers, of which 2 were terminated from the company due to company needs: Employee 1: Terminated on May 30, 2020, due to ""company needs"". Employee 2: Terminated on May 30, 2020, due to ""company needs"". Employee 1 and Employee 2 as of May 30, 2020 represented 66% (2 of 3) of the workers. One was given a letter of recommendation and got a job within a month, and only one was more affected as it took six months to get another job. One round of dismissal can be considered: May 30, 2020 with the dismissal of two workers.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	Primary impact was loss of employment for affected employees.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	The company paid compensation to its dismissed workers in accordance with the proportional holiday concept. It can be highlighted that the company has carried out good communication management of the decisions made both with the outgoing staff and with the staff that remain in the organization.
RELATED INCIDENTS (YES/NO)	No, this was the only incident
