Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

TOPIC	Recalls due to undeclared allergens and wrong use by date on products.
SUMMARY OF ISSUE	O'Brien Fine Foods has had a total of 4 product recalls in the last five years:
	 Recalls related to undeclared allergens Recall 1: August 2018 Brady Family Glazed ham, label supplier error. Recall 2: February 2022 Glazed and grilled sliced ham, ingredient supplier sent in wrong ingredient which contained an allergen and subsequently checked in under the wrong product. Operational team was unaware of the presence of the allergen. Recalls due to wrong use by date on product Recall 3: October 2018 Dunnes Carved Turkey.
	Recall 4: January 2019 Centra Carved Turkey.
	Both cases involved an incorrect month being inserted on the labeling machine by operative, with no manager signing off work at the time.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Recall 1: 324 boxes representing 0.006% of overall production in 2018. Recall 2: 671 boxes 0.02% of overall production in 2020. Recall 3: 77 boxes, 0.002% of overall production in 2018. Recall 4: 50 boxes, 0.0006% of overall production in 2018
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	The two recall incidents related to the presence of allergens although could have caused an allergic reaction to consumers, there were no reported incidents or injuries. In relation to the recalls with the incorrect used by dates, recall 3 presented a potential risk of food related illness, yet no incidents were reported. In recall 4, the products were removed before reaching consumers and no harm was presented to consumers.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	 Practices to avoid unreported allergens in products: Food allergen present in recall 1 was removed completely from the product. If an allergen is included in a product, the product operative signing off the label has to circle off the allergen. Supplier of labels has put additional controls to eliminate risk. Ingredients supplier in recall 2 was made aware of issue. Intake team has been trained to check product against product code and label to avoid confusion with ingredients. Practices to avoid mislabeling of use by date Only trained operatives are now allowed to use labeling machine There is a double sign-off on labels Quality check of finished product includes label.
