




Executive Summary






Introduction to The Popcorn Kitchen


We are committed to this change for good and we couldn't be more excited about building our purpose-led business in 2024.

2024

Working with Reewild – Created a carbon offset journey, Gold standard initiatives removing 50 tonne of carbon




Julain and the amazing team at Crisis, support to end homelessness and at Christmas create lovely hampers for their clients.



Off Setting our Popcorn Carbon Footprint in 2023

2023 Carbon Footprint

To offset our carbon footprint we first must calculate it. In 2023 for our office and indirect carbon emissions:

Scope 1 = 0.3 tonnes of CO2

Scope 2 = 0.1 tonnes of CO2

Total Scope 1 and Scope 2 = 0.4 tonnes of CO2*

With the help of Reewild, we have supported reforestation efforts across the world. We have chosen to invest in several Eden Reforestation projects, an NGO dedicated to improving livelihoods and protecting landscapes on a massive scale.

The trees we have planted are helping to reverse climate change, global deforestation, and habitat loss for endangered species. As Eden Reforestation follow a people-first approach, we are also giving back to the local communities that are highly impacted by the climate crisis. The success of each project and the communities 'success are inextricably entwined.

Reducing our impact on the environment 2023



FSC – Cardboard

All our cardboard is FSC certified, meaning that the forests are being managed in a way that preserves biological diversity. All our cases use this material and are made with a minimum 30% recycled content

Plastic Bottles

All of our plastic bottles are designed to be re-used or recycled kerb-side. In 2023, we started to use a small amount of recycled content in our giant bottles – we will build on this on 2024.


Film

All of our film used is recycled code 5 and can be recycled, we are reviewing new innovations to source a high barrier solution which is kerb side recyclable or biodegradable

Circular Economy

We are always on the lookout for innovative ways we can use recycled packaging, in 2023 the ribbons on our Christmas Stockings are made from re-cycled plastic bottles
