Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

Any party may submit a complaint about a current B Corp through B Lab's Public Complaint Process. Grounds for complaint include:

- Intentional misrepresentation of practices, policies, and/or claimed outcomes during the company's certification process
- Breaches of the B Corp Community's core values as expressed in our Declaration of Interdependence

Summary of Issue	AG Sustentable is a firm focused in the area of Sustainability Consulting.
	The company has had clients in the Alcohol, Animal Products or Services, Bottled water companies, Fossil Fuels (non-coal/oil sands) & Fossil Fuels which includes coal/oil sands, Gambling, Mining, Pharmaceuticals, Tax Advisory Services and Whole life insurance products.
	The services provided to the clients relate to Sustainability Diagnosis & Action Plan and Sustainability Reporting.
	The services provided to the clients can be sold to other clients in different industries, including other both non-controversial and controversial industries, although it is tailored from client/industry to client/industry.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	The following are the revenue derived from each of the industry in the year of 2024;
	 4% of total revenue from Animal Products or Services industries 2% of total revenue from Bottled water companies 15% of total revenue from Fossil Fuels – non coal/oil sands industries % of total revenue from Fossil Fuels (includes coal/oil sands) industries 2% of total revenue from Mining industries 3% of total revenue from Pharmaceuticals industries 10% of total revenue from Whole life insurance products industries
	The company had last provided services to clients in the gambling industry in the year of 2023 and had earned 4% of revenue from the industry.



	The company had last provided services to clients in the alcohol and tax advisory industry in the year of 2022 and had earned 3% and 2% of revenue from respective industries.
Impact on Stakeholders	Companies that work with clients in controversial industries can indirectly increase the harmful impact on stakeholders of those businesses by enabling their business growth. Therefore, companies that work with clients in these industries should have practices in place to ensure that their impact is aimed at decreasing the negative impacts of the industry.
	Currently, B Lab does not have specific requirements for companies with clients in this/these industries. However, Certified B Corps are required to make transparent their involvement with such clients. As B Lab continues to evolve its standards and due diligence approach for companies with Clients in Controversial Industries, the updated criteria will be shared with the company once they are finalized.
	B Lab recognizes that the company began its verification process prior to B Lab developing standards for Clients in Controversial Industries, and, therefore, the company will be required to meet the new standards by their next recertification. Additionally, as of the date of this disclosure, the company has committed to not working with any new companies or projects involved in the controversial industries in question.
Implemented Management Practices	AG Sustentable currently does not have a formal position on working with sensitive industries or a policy to move away from them.
	The company considers potential clients through the Executive Board that would evaluate if their services can improve clients' transparency and overall impact in terms of people and environment.
	Providing support in the area of Sustainability, the company aims to give the possibility to companies in controversial industries to reduce their negative impact and improve the Transparency and Accountability of their businesses and activities.
	The Management Team of AG Sustentable is informed of new client registrations and any potential disputes with these clients



are discussed if deemed appropriate. The company is aware of the public repercussions of its clients in controversial industries. The company's aim is to always work within the framework of transparency, accountability and continuous improvement, helping to identify the impact of its clients' activities and proposing improvements through a report of conclusions and opportunities for improvement in Sustainability and Accountability.
