Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Suppliers located in Conflict Zones

Topic	Company has suppliers located in Conflict Zones
Summary of Issue	Rudolph Care is a wholesaler for beauty and care products based in Denmark. The company purchases shea butter originated from Burkina Faso which has been identified as a conflict zone by the World Bank due to an ongoing civil war.
	The supplier in the conflict zone represents a tier-3 supplier. The company purchases the finished product containing the shea butter through a third-party production, who is supplied by a sourcing Agency and then the direct source who sells the shea butter.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the fiscal year end of 2023, 0.89% of the company's total purchases were from the conflict affected zone.
Impact on Stakeholders	Business activities located in conflict zones are considered high-risk as they are more likely to cause or contribute to the conflict and/or sociopolitical instability.
	Countries classified as conflict zones are more likely to have a weak rule-of-law or a corrupt judicial system, which could undermine the effectiveness of operational grievance mechanisms for these businesses and their suppliers. In addition, the safety of the company's workers and other potential human rights violations are at risk.
Implemented Management Practices	Olvea, which is the main supplier of the shea butters based in Burkina Faso, has a whole integrated supply chain. They also produce and sell fair-trade raw materials which includes the Shea butter. The products are fair-trade certified by Ecocert, which guarantees that the producers receive a fair price throughout the supply chain, improve their production tools, and have the means to carry out collective projects through a dedicated development fund.
	Rudolph Care has a Supplier Code of Conduct in place to ensure its suppliers comply with the principles of the <u>United Nation's (UN) Global Compact</u> , the <u>UN's Universal Declaration of Human Rights</u> , the <u>International Labor Organizations (ILO) Declaration on Labor Rights</u> and the <u>Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD's) Anti-Bribery</u>



<u>Convention</u>. The company requires all of its suppliers to sign the code of conduct, acknowledging that they would follow the principles set and failure to comply with the code of conduct could result in the termination of the collaboration with the Supplier.

Rudolph Care currently is in the process of implementing due diligence for its suppliers to ensure ongoing risk assessments, and processes for follow-up on plan for risk management strategies in alignment with <u>OECD's guidelines for Multinational Enterprises (MNEs)</u> and the due diligence guidance.
