Disclosure Questionnaire Statement

Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Industries at risk for human rights violations

Topic	Company sells jewelry with gemstones and precious metals
Summary of Issue	Blackacre is a UK based company that sells premium luxury jewelry made from gold, diamonds and gemstones. The company purchases cut diamonds from UK based diamond dealers/wholesalers that source finished diamonds from around 10 different diamond cutters distributed around the world (India, Antwerp, Israel). With regards to gemstones, Blackacre sources both their own gemstones by traveling to the country of origin to purchase directly from mines (e.g. Sri Lanka) as well as purchase from a UK based third party dealer/wholesaler.
	Manufacturing of jewelry is outsourced to a third party and precious metals used within those workshops are recycled (18k yellow gold, platinum and 18k rose gold).
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Approximately 10% of the company's total expenses are from precious metal purchases. 53.19% of the company's supplier expenses are from RJC certified suppliers, of which 3% corresponds to RJC COC supplier expenses.
Impact on Stakeholders	The use of precious metals and gemstones poses a human rights risk due to the possibility that they are sourced from conflict-affected and high risk areas, where they may be used to finance conflict and/or be associated with human rights abuses in the supply chain. Specifically the mining sector has a high potential of human rights abuses given the elevated risks of fatal accidents, abusive labor practices, discrimination against women and environmental pollution and degradation.
Implemented Management Practices	Blackacre has created a Supplier Code of Conduct (see link below) requiring suppliers to adhere to specific requirements in relation to: -Work and Human Rights, including prohibition of forced and child labor, fair compensation and benefits, no tolerance to abuse among others. -Business Ethics and integrity -Respect for and enhancement of local communities -Respect for and Protection of Natural Ecosystems



	-Product liability- sustainable and ethical product development and traceability of materials and productsCompliance and dissemination- requiring cooperation in compliance assessments and obligation to remedy and adhere to future code updates.
	All of the company's suppliers of precious metals have signed the Blackacre Supplier Code of Conduct, committing to align with the established standards. Blackacre has also requested information of the checks performed over the last 12 months to verify suppliers' due diligence with their own supply chain, and policies and standards in place.
