- 1) Intentional misrepresentation of practices, policies, and/or claimed outcomes during the company's certification process

Issue Date	2020-2025
Topic	Litigations related to Employee Safety and Contract Dispute
Summary of Issue	The company has one pending litigation related to an accident on a roof, whereby an employee of the company had an injury and hematomas.
	The company also has one settled penalty as a result of conducting work outside the authorized zone. The company's client was in charge of getting the authorization; the groundworks had already been done by another client's contractor. The company was assured that the permission was already granted and had no means to receive it directly from the concerned party. The information regarding the authorization was only oral, and the neighbor finally did not agree.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	The financial impact related to the employee injury is estimated to be equivalent to 1-5% of the company's total revenue in the last fiscal year. The penalty paid in relation to the work conducted outside the permitted zone is equivalent to less than 1% of the company's total revenue in the last fiscal year.
Impact on Stakeholders	Potential safety risks to employees and a minor financial impact to the company.
Resolution	One litigation related to an employee accident is pending a final outcome, and the case related to the work conducted beyond the permitted area resulted in a penalty.
Management Practices	In mitigating on-the-job accidents for its employees, the company has reinforced its safety system. The company has taken into account this accident in its safety documentation. Specific training for this operation is now being done with the teams. In the case related to work being conducted outside the permitted zone, the company has included in its checklist of Impact Evaluation a point dedicated to the authorization.

Topic	Clients in Controversial and Ineligible Industries
Summary of Issue	GROUPE JARNIAS has clients in the following industries: Offensive Firearms/Weapons/Defense, Fossil-Fuel, Mining, Nuclear Power or Radioactive Materials, Pharmaceuticals, and Prisons.
	The types of services/products offered to these clients include infrastructure and industrial maintenance, fixing and installing building appliances in clients' facilities. They specialize in the field of work at height and difficult access, protection, security, and training. Scaffolding, buildings that require complex building processes.
	The company has been exempted from the <u>Prison Risk Standard</u> as they no longer has clients in the prison industry. The company would commit to the Prison Risk Standards should it choose to work with the prison industry in the future.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the last fiscal year, 1.40% of the groupe's annual revenue was from clients in the defense industry, 3.62.% from the fossil-fuel industry, 4.15% from the nuclear power/radioactive industry, and 0.01% from the prison industry. The company has also worked with clients in other controversial industries, including pharmaceuticals and mining. The company has not earned any revenue from clients since 2023.
Impact on Stakeholders	Companies that work with clients in controversial industries can directly or indirectly increase the harmful impact to stakeholders by enabling business growth. Therefore, companies that work with clients in these industries should have practices in place to ensure that their impact is aimed at decreasing the negative impacts of the industry.
	Companies offering certain types of services and products to controversial clients are required to have at a minimum a grievance/complaints mechanism and a whistleblower protection policy.



Implemented Management Practices	B Lab has been able to verify that the company has the necessary mechanisms in place to manage the risks related to their business relationships with clients in controversial and ineligible industries, in line with B Lab's requirements (see link below). This includes: • A mechanism for internal and external stakeholders to raise grievances; • A policy that is shared with individuals who raise a
	 grievance, containing information related to the grounds for accepting a grievance and how their grievance will be dealt with, as well as related timelines. A Whistleblower Policy that establishes the company's commitment to protecting whistleblower identity as well as the processes and controls in place to protect stakeholders who raise grievances from any form of retaliation.
