

DISCLOSURE MATERIALS

This component does not affect the company's score on the B Impact Assessment. If the company answers affirmatively to any items in the Disclosure Questionnaire and B Lab deems them to be material, the company must:

- 1) Be transparent about the disclosure issues identified on the company's public B Impact Report
- 2) Describe how the company has addressed this issue.
- 3) Demonstrate that management systems are in place to avoid similar issues from arising in the future.

In all cases, the Standards Advisory council reserves the right to refuse certification if the company is ultimately deemed not to uphold the spirit of the community.

Background checks include a review of public records, news sources, and search engines for company names, brands, executives/founders, and other relevant topics.

Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

SUMMARY OF ISSUE	As a brewery, Brussels Beer Project operates in an industry that is water intensive.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the previous fiscal year, 98% of Brussels Beer Project's revenue was earned from the sale of alcohol.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	As a water intensive industry, brewing poses risks such as water stress or depletion of local water sources if water use is not appropriately managed.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	"To manage the water resources the company uses, Brussels Beer Project has installed flow meters and dashboards. The flow meters allow them to measure the water consumption, and the dashboard allows them to follow the readings of different meters. In 2021, the company had a water usage goal of 10L of water/package and achieved 8.3L of water/package, which was ~20% below their target.
	They are also working on optimizing cleaning and rinsing installations. This enables the brewery to save water by carrying out longer production batches and reducing the cleaning frequency in between. Also, an extra rainwater tank was placed for better utilization of the water."

IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	Alcohol may have a negative impact on the health and well-being of individuals and their communities
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	Brussels Beer Project complies with all of the regulations and laws related to the sale of alcohol in the jurisdictions where it operates. All employees have to pass the Certified Beer Server from Cicerone organization within the first 6 months of joining the company. To mitigate the risk of over-serving, the company has tasting glasses of 12.5cl or 15cl in their taprooms and no 50cl options of strong beers are served. Moreover, the majority of their lagers are below 5% of alcohol. Non-alcoholic beer options are also offered. Also, ID is requested from customers to avoid serving minors.
