Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Chemical Intensive industry

Daye is involved in the production/sale of products, or is part of an industry that can potentially be classified as chemical intensive, meaning that they are more likely to have significant impacts on the environment, such as pollution of air, land, and water, as well as potential human health risks to those exposed to harmful chemicals if the use and disposal of chemicals are not properly managed. Certified B Corps are required to make transparent their involvement in such activities or industries.



Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Energy and Emissions Intensive industry

Daye is involved in the production/sale of products, or is part of an industry that can potentially be classified as energy and emission-intensive, meaning that they are more likely to have significant impacts on the environment based on their carbon emissions associated with their operations and their contribution to climate change. Certified B Corps are required to make transparent their involvement in such activities or industries.



Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Water Intensive industry

Daye is involved in the production/sale of products, or is part of an industry that can potentially be classified as water intensive, meaning that they are more likely to have significant impacts on the environment, such as water stress or depletion of local water sources if water use is not appropriately managed. Certified B Corps are required to make transparent their involvement in such activities or industries.



Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Zero Hour Contracts

Annes Day Ltd has an employee under Zero Hour Contract which allows the employer to vary the working hours of an employee, with no guarantee of employee hours, while the employee is required to be on call. Certified B Corps are required to make transparent their involvement in such industries.



Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Animal Testing

Topic	Company is required to undergo mandatory animal testing by law
Summary of Issue	Anne's Day Ltd is a personal care products company that produces CBD Tampon products that are required to be tested on animals by law in the markets where they operate.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	25% of the company's products undergo animal testing.
Impact on Stakeholder(s)	Animal testing and experimentation is widely used to develop new agricultural products and to test the safety of other products. Many of these experiments can cause pain to the animals involved or reduce their quality of life in other ways.
Implemented Management Practices	Daye actively sought alternatives to animal testing and began developing artificial vaginal canal and mucosa models, as well as artificial vaginal fluid, to replace the need for animal studies. However, at the time of regulatory submission, these alternatives were not accepted by authorities, and animal testing remained a legal requirement. The company only utilized animal testing because regulators would not accept alternatives and insisted on animal data for safety validation. Daye outsourced the animal testing to external laboratories. The study was performed by a laboratory called Charles River - https://www.criver.com/. The animal studies were conducted to ISO10993 standards, which include clear guidelines for the humane treatment of laboratory animals. These standards are internationally recognized and set requirements for minimizing animal suffering and ensuring ethical treatment throughout the testing process. The animal testing was a one-off event, limited to the development of the CBD tampon. Only a single product (the CBD tampon) underwent animal testing, which currently accounts for about 25% of sales.



Animal testing was only conducted once, during the initial development and regulatory submission of the CBD tampon. Daye will not repeat these studies in the future, so the percentage of products undergoing animal testing has not increased and is not expected to increase.

Daye emphasizes transparency and invites feedback from its community and subscribers. The company openly communicates the reasons for animal testing and its efforts to minimize it, and encourages ongoing dialogue to address concerns and improve practices. They also invest in research and development of alternative testing methods and plan to open source these developments for broader industry benefit. Daye has also engaged with PETA (People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals) and presented their case to collaborate on developing alternative validation pathways.

Daye only conducts animal testing when legally required and after exhausting efforts to find alternatives.

All animal studies are performed to ISO10993 standards for humane treatment.

The company invests in developing and open-sourcing alternative testing models (artificial vaginal canal and fluid) to help eliminate the need for animal testing in the future.

Daye commits to not repeating animal studies and works with regulators and other companies to advocate for minimization of animal testing.

Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Cannabis Related Products

Topic	Personal care products with cannabidiol (CBD)
Summary of Issue	Anne's Day Ltd is a retailer of menstrual care products that earns a material amount of revenue from the sale of products containing CBD oil. CBD oils are derived from industrial hemp, a cannabis -related product
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the previous fiscal year, about 40% of Anne's Day Ltd's revenue was earned from the sale of products containing CBD oil.
Impact on Stakeholder(s)	Cannabis-related products are subject to controversy both because of their current and historic legal status around the world, as well as concerns about the potential harm that the products may cause. Current regulations governing the legality of cannabis-derived products are complex and vary widely by local jurisdiction.
Implemented Management Practices	Anne's Day Ltd currently sells its CBD products in the UK and Europe. Local regulations require the complete absence of THC in any CBD products, and the company is complying with that. Tests with a third-party accredited lab are conducted on every single batch of CBD oil used to ensure compliance.
