



## DISCLOSURE MATERIALS

Certified B Corporations must complete a Disclosure Questionnaire to identify potentially sensitive issues related to the company (e.g. historical fines, sanctions, material litigation, or sensitive industry practices).

This component does not affect the company's score on the B Impact Assessment. If the company answers affirmatively to any items in the Disclosure Questionnaire and B Lab deems them to be material, the company must:

- 1) Be transparent about the disclosure issues identified on the company's public B Impact Report
- 2) Describe how the company has addressed this issue.
- 3) Demonstrate that management systems are in place to avoid similar issues from arising in the future.

In all cases, the Standards Advisory council reserves the right to refuse certification if the company is ultimately deemed not to uphold the spirit of the community.

In addition to the voluntary indication of sensitive issues in the Disclosure Questionnaire, companies pursuing Certification also are subject to background checks by B Lab staff. Background checks include a review of public records, news sources, and search engines for company names, brands, executives/founders, and other relevant topics.

Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

<b>DISCLOSURE QUESTIONNAIRE CATEGORY</b>	Company uses workers who are prisoners
<b>ISSUE DATE</b>	March 2019 - Present
<b>TOPIC</b>	Company has worker placements at a pilot program at the Establecimiento Penitenciario Modelo Ancón II in Peru.
<b>SUMMARY OF ISSUE</b>	<p>Hoseg participates in a pilot program that allows inmates to work for the company as workshop assistants. According to legal requirements, this program would not meet guidance provided by the International Labor Organization regarding the use of prison labor. Specifically, the program would not meet the following requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(1) Worker receives and signs a standardized consent form from the enterprise indicating that they agree to work</li> <li>(2) The conditions of work the enterprise offers are similar to work outside the prison</li> <li>(3) Workers have the possibility of continuing work of the same type upon release</li> </ul>
<b>SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE</b> (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	The company has had around 20 short term placements from this program, which represented 16% of supplier expenditure by the close of 2019.
<b>IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDER(S)</b>	The International Labor Organization has provided guidance on required practices for companies utilizing prison labor in order to ensure that such labor preserves the rights of workers, is in their best interests, and is not exploitative.
<b>RESOLUTION</b>	Currently, companies utilizing prison labor are required to comply with guidance provided by the International Labor Organization in order to be eligible for B Corp Certification. B Lab is in the process of conducting an expert stakeholder engagement process, which will result in a final judgment from the Standards Advisory Council and Board of Directors regarding this requirement. The results are expected to be finalized prior to the end of 2020. At that time, Hoseg will be required to meet the updated prison labor requirements in order to maintain its B Corp Certification.
