| SUMMARY OF ISSUE   | As a manufacturer of supplements and health related products, Herbarium operates in an industry that is water intensive. Water is not only a key ingredient in some of the final products but is also required for cleaning the manufacturing equipment.   |
| SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE<br>(e.g. \$ financial implication, #<br>of individuals affected) | The company uses around 755m3 of water per month and the total consumption for 2019 was 8282.67m3. 99.12% was extracted from an artisan well, 0.88% from the local concessionaire. Reuse water accounted for 9.82%. Purified water accounts for the largest water consumption of water at 24.44% of all water use in 2019.   |
| IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDER(S)   | Industries that are water intensive risk impacting their local water tables and disproportionately consume water at a rate that contributes to the depletion of local water sources over time if not appropriately managed. Affected stakeholders may therefore include local agriculture, local ecosystems, and communities in water-scarce or water insecure areas.  The company extracts water from an underground aquifer that is approved by the Aguas Parana, the Water Institute of Parana. |
| IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES  | Herabrium uses three sources of water in their production process: Harvested rain water, Drinking water from a local well with a maximum extraction capacity and reuse water, of which the company has the capacity to utilise 80 million litres.  |
|  | The company monitors and measures their monthly and annual water usage. All water to be discharged first passes through their effluent treatment center (ETE), after this stage the water is released into a pond that has already been purified, and then goes to a stream, the whole process is controlled by measurements to ensure purity of the released water.   |
|  | The company has set water targets for 2020 of 1.49 litres/Unit Produced, which they are currently meeting. Quantatively, they have a target to reduce water usage by 5% per year. The company facilities are not located in an area of high water stress, they are located in the hydrographic basin of the Iguacu River, the largest river in the State of Parana.  |
| OTHER MANAGEMENT<br>COMMENTS   | Herbarium regularly reports data on the quantity and quality of water drawn from the local well to the country's government agencies, thus ensuring transparency in this process, as well as fulfilling all requirements for it to be a sustainable source of water. In addition, the water treatment work after use, ensures that the water returns to the stream with excellent quality. The data can be consulted directly in government agencies.  |

| IMPLEMENTED MGT<br>PRACTICES   | The company has implemented new management practices in order to reduce further labor lawsuits, such as more control during working time (management supervision; no access to internet).  |
| OTHER MANAGEMENT<br>COMMENTS   | The majority of the cases involving overtime arose from the Rio Grande do Sul State, where there are special functions attributed to the entry and exit time (journey time) of an employee and hours worked and this is the root cause of all demands in that State - note: the Company has no journey control because (i) this is not possible with this function and (ii) there no existing practice of overtime in this function. |
