

DISCLOSURE MATERIALS

Certified B Corporations must complete a Disclosure Questionnaire to identify potentially sensitive issues related to the company (e.g. historical fines, sanctions, material litigation, or sensitive industry practices).

This component does not affect the company's score on the B Impact Assessment. If the company answers affirmatively to any items in the Disclosure Questionnaire and B Lab deems them to be material, the company must:

- 1) Be transparent about the disclosure issues identified on the company's public B Impact Report
- 2) Describe how the company has addressed this issue.
- 3) Demonstrate that management systems are in place to avoid similar issues from arising in the future.

In all cases, the Standards Advisory council reserves the right to refuse certification if the company is ultimately deemed not to uphold the spirit of the community.

In addition to the voluntary indication of sensitive issues in the Disclosure Questionnaire, companies pursuing Certification also are subject to background checks by B Lab staff. Background checks include a review of public records, news sources, and search engines for company names, brands, executives/founders, and other relevant topics.

Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

TOPIC	Company sources green coffee beans from the Democratic Republic of Congo, Ethiopia, Mexico and Colombia.
SUMMARY OF ISSUE	Conscious Coffees sources green coffee beans from tier 1 suppliers in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), Ethiopia, Mexico and Colombia.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	 - 8% of total bean inputs came from the Colombia. - 2% of total bean inputs came from the DRC. - 22% of total bean inputs came from Ethiopia. - 5% of total bean inputs came from the DRC.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	The conflicts in Mexico directly affect the farmers as some of them have been arrested due to their connection with the Zapatista movement. The company does not have data on the amount of farmers who are affected in Mexico. However, one farmer was arrested for being on a road that had been outlawed by the government due to use by the Zapatistas. The conflict in Ethiopia affecting their ability to get their product to market. The company buys directly from the farmer co-ops - Cooperative Coffees.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	All the company coffee beans are certified Fair Trade. The company opts to support these businesses and the communities in which they operate. The company does not go into the conflict zone whenever there is any threat of violence. Whenever they do enter into the conflict zone, they make sure to go in large groups for safety.
