Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

B Lab's Public Complaints Process

Any party may submit a complaint about a current B Corp through B Lab's Public Complaint Process. Grounds for complaint include:

- 1) Intentional misrepresentation of practices, policies, and/or claimed outcomes during the company's certification process
- Breaches of the B Corp Community's core values as expressed in our Declaration of Interdependence

Topic	Energy and Emissions Intensive Industry
Summary of Issue	Wilderness Motorhomes rents out motorhomes and campervans for travel across the country. https://www.wilderness.co.nz/about-us/our-history . As a motorhome renter and seller, Wilderness Motorhomes operates in an industry in which energy and carbon emissions are a material environmental issue. The primary source of the company's carbon footprint stems from the operation of the Wilderness Motorhomes by its end customers. The company has developed near-term emissions reduction
	targets to 2030 that are fully aligned with the Science Based Targets initiative (SBTi) methodology. These were created in partnership with their sustainability consultant, and have been formally approved by the senior leadership team and business owners. These targets have not yet been submitted to SBTi for validation, and the company is actively implementing initiatives to achieve them, tracking all related emissions and impacts, and reviewing progress regularly.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	The total emissions for FY24 were Scope 1 = 132.81tCO2e, Scope 2 = 18.42tCO2e, Scope 3 = 2,117.21tCO2e
Impact on Stakeholders	The automotive industry is a major contributor to global carbon emissions. B Lab has flagged the automotive and machinery industry as an energy—and emissions-intensive industry that will require a standards development process to assess its risk. Companies on the B Corp Certification pipeline are required to meet the following: 1. The company is committed to contributing to help keep global warming below 1.5 °C. 2. The company has a publicly available climate action plan
Implemented Management Practices	This is the company's commitment to the near-term target approved by SBTi:



"Wilderness Motorhomes commits to reducing absolute emissions by 2030, Scope 1 by 46.26% and Scope 2 by 42% from a 2024 base year, and reaching net zero by 2050.

Here are the company's current practices to address the risks caused by its direct and indirect emissions:

- The company is committed to contributing to help keep global warming below 1.5 °C.
- The company has a publicly available climate action plan.
- Wilderness Motorhomes plans to reduce its fleet fuel consumption by phasing out ICE vehicles with electric vehicles and reducing the quantity of fuel purchased. The emissions factor for fleet fuel (across each of the three grades) is slowly decreasing as vehicles and fuel become more efficient.
- Wilderness Motorhomes plans to reduce scope 2 by shifting to renewable energy, reducing demand, or increasing electricity efficiency across Wilderness' sites.
- The company also plans to reduce Scope 3 by reducing water use through the use of more water-efficient equipment, rainwater capture and water recycling systems, reduction of waste through engaging with suppliers on more highly recyclable and repairable products can help design waste out of the system.
- Wilderness Motorhomes plans to reduce the Scope 3 emissions by rental customers, by helping customers reduce kilometres driven by offering novel products such as dual rentals from both its Christchurch and Auckland bases, allowing customers to rent a motorhome but not drive such large distances to see attractions in both the North and South Islands. Wilderness can also further its education of customers, including through the use of pre-planned itineraries and consultations.
