## **Disclosure Materials**

Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

## **Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Others - Disclosure Industries**

Topic	Clients in Controversial Industries
Summary of Issue	The company is a law firm providing legal advice on contractual disputes and employment law issues to companies and individuals across a variety of sectors, including clients in the Gambling and Mining industries in the United Kingdom. Their services can be sold to both controversial as well as non-controversial industries.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	The revenue from clients in the Gambling industry represented 0.43% in FY 22-23. The revenue from clients in the Mining industry represented 0.3% in FY 22-23.
Impact on Stakeholders	Companies that work with clients in controversial industries can indirectly increase the harmful impact to stakeholders by enabling business growth. Therefore, companies that work with clients in these industries should have practices in place to ensure that their impact is aimed at decreasing the negative impacts of the industry.
	B Lab has flagged the involvement of companies with clients in controversial industries as a material issue and new standards will be created to address possible risks related to this matter.
Implemented Management Practices	Bellevue Law currently does not have a position on working with clients in controversial sectors, but screens their clients before agreeing to act for any company in controversial sectors to ensure clients meet the firm's ethical standards. Bellevue Law has a code of Ethics within their company manual and reserves the right not to work with any client who does not meet their ethical standards and where there is a question about the ethics of a particular client or their industry. Formal approval from the company's Founder must be sought in such cases before a lawyer is able to accept instructions to act.  Lawyers are required to flag potentially controversial clients and detailed consideration is given on a case-by-case basis to
	consider whether it is appropriate for the company to act for clients in controversial industries.



	In relation to the company's work with clients in the Mining industry, the company works with one client who is a supplier of more sustainable technologies to this sector. The company does not work for large mining companies.
