Торіс	Clients in Controversial Industries
Summary of Issue	SparkOptimus is a digital consultancy that has had clients in the Alcohol, Fossil Fuels (Coal, oil sands), Gambling, Industries at risk of human rights violations, Marketing of Breastmilk Substitutes, Bottled Water and Pharmaceuticals industries over the last 5 years. Services to clients in these industries include digital strategy, digital transformation, ventures, due diligence and data services; all which can be sold to companies in both controversial as well as non-controversial industries.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	 The % of revenue from the company's FY2022 represented by clients in these industries was the following: Alcohol industry: 7.60% Fossil Fuel (coal, oil sands) industry: 1.30% Clients from Industries at Risk of Human Rights Violations (cocoa, coffee, clothing apparel): 14.50% Marketing of Breastmilk Substitutes: 2.10% Bottled Water industry: 1.10% Pharmaceuticals: 0% (2.20% in 2020), no longer work with clients in this industry. Work with the above industries is still ongoing. Gambling industry: 1.40%. The company has made a formal commitment to no longer work with clients in this industry and has not had revenue from clients in this industry in the FY2023.
Impact on Stakeholders	Companies that work with clients in controversial industries can indirectly increase the harmful impact to stakeholders by enabling business growth. Therefore, companies that work with clients in these industries should have practices in place to ensure that their impact is aimed at decreasing the negative impacts of the industry. B Lab has flagged the involvement of companies with clients in controversial industries as a material issue and new standards will be created to address possible risks related to this matter.



Implemented Management Practices

SparkOptimus chooses to work with clients that are active in their sustainability transition and willing to change. When receiving a request for engagement, the leadership team meets to decide on a case-by-case basis whether to move forward or not; a decision that is substantiated by an outside-in due diligence performed by their own team using publicly available data. The company has turned down clients from the Tobacco industry, Fossil Fuel (coal, oil sands) and the Alcohol industry yet does not currently have a position on working with clients in controversial industries.

Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Compulsory Overtime

Issue Date	Ongoing
Topic	Hourly workers required to work overtime due to seasonal harvesting requirements and situational overtime requirements.
Summary of Issue	SparkOptimus offers strategic and tailored consultancy services and their work is project based. All employees have several projects a year with varying busy periods. Working overtime on projects is needed in busier times or busier days and is not part of the company's work structure. The project manager is responsible for the workload and if the workload is too high, or the overtime takes longer than one or two weeks, the scope of the project is adjusted or the team size is adjusted to the workload. All employees are subject to working overtime hours and are made aware of this at the time of hiring, as it is also an industry practice. SparkOptimus overtime requirements are communicated at the
	time of hiring, and overtime is compensated with fixed salaries that are higher than average, to compensate for longer working days. Overtime hours are not eligible for separate compensation.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	SparkOptimus employees work 49h/week on average. In the previous fiscal year 100% of the company's workforce was subject to and worked overtime hours. Approximately 10.8 weeks of the previous fiscal year required employees to work 45h/w and approximately 4.8 weeks of the previous fiscal year required employees to work more than 50h/w.
	The maximum amount of hours worked by an employee was 60 hours per week, 12 hours per day.
Impact on Stakeholders	Employees that work compulsory overtime can experience increased stress and have less time to spend on activities



	outside of the workplace, such as spending time at home.
Implemented Management Practices	SparkOptimus carries out bi-weekly barometer measurements to evaluate overtime, work-life balance and state of mind of their employees. In addition, employees have access to 1:1 coaching, training on stress management and burn out prevention. To minimize the need for compulsory overtime the company has sharpened their guidelines for project calculators. If an employee cannot meet overtime or refuses to, it is known to the SparkOptimus team that it is a joint responsibility to make deadlines and the team seeks a flexible solution to make up for the work that this employee cannot carry out.
Related Incidents (Yes/No)	There have been no health or safety issues related to overtime hours to date.
