| SUMMARY OF ISSUE | Ingenio Providencia is a company that produces food, energy solutions and fertilizers, all its products being derived from sugar cane and represented mainly by: sugars, alcohols, electrical energy and compost. |
| SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected) | Ingenio controls 11,496 hectares between the modalities of own land, participation and leased. 100% of this area is cultivated, there are no vacant lands. Organic production accounts for 10% of overall revenue. |
| IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS | Large scale monoculture agriculture can result in biodiversity loss to local flora and fauna through the use of pesticides and herbicides and can negatively impact soil health. |
| IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES | The company is Bonsucro certified and was the first sugar mill to produce organic sugar in Colombia. They manage the preservation or conservation of biodiversity through practices and / or policies such as: • Development of organic sugarcane crops. • Use of green cut for the cane harvest avoiding its burning. • Implementation of reduced tillage in soil preparations. • Protection of natural areas through the conservation of forests. • Development of tree restoration programs and biological corridors. • Protection of wetlands and implementation of protective forest strips of rivers in agreement with the local environmental authority. • Growth in agricultural areas from areas already planted and from areas not restricted for agriculture according to the Territorial Ordinance or Conservation Plan • Implementation of comprehensive pest management and varietal management of sugarcane for disease control • Constitution and strengthening of the Providencia ecological park, currently representing 414 hectares. The mill has 58% of organic sugarcane on its own land, where green manure and compost are used as a source of fertilizer. In addition, manual and / or mechanical control is used to control weeds avoiding the use of herbicides. There are also practices such as integrated pest management and varietal management for disease control. |

| SUMMARY OF ISSUE | One fatality occurred due to a safety failure at the facility. The second fatality occurred due to a road accident while the employee was on work travel. |

| IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS | Loss of life and impact to family and friends of deceased workers. |
| RESOLUTION | Both incidents were reported to the Ministry of Labour and the Occupational Risk Administration with the conclusion that the first fatality occurred due to a safety failure in the factory equipment and the second accident occurred due to a public risk as it was the fault of a private vehicle. |
| RESOLUTION | In both cases, the company launched strategic practices for Security and Health in the Workplace under the guidance of the Manager for Human Resources. |
| | FIRST CASE: 1. The company carried out changes in the elements of the lifting gear in the grinding area. 2. Polyester type slings were removed. 3. It was replaced by crawler chains that give better resistance with a capacity of 15 tons and with a safety factor of 7, the maximum safety offered by these chains is 7 times the nominal load capacity, to withstand the maximum capacity of the hoist, which is 50 tons Compared to the previous ones, which were 3-ton slings with a safety factor of 5 times. 4. Sensors were installed to know the capacity and weight of the load that is being hoisted at that moment. 5. Equipment with Controls that allow the overhead crane operator to know the data more easily. 6. The OPYM 0739 procedure was updated where the step-by-step for changing the slings was established, with training of employees so that the risk is minimized, establishing a sequence of |

It was established that when a worker is performing irrigation at night, he must finish his work on the farm and from there move to his place of residence, without moving between farms to perform other work 2. Training of safe handling of off-road motorcycles is carried out to the personnel. 3. Vehicle inspections are carried out in order to comply with the provisions of the National Traffic Code. |
