SUMMARY OF ISSUE	As a meat manufacturer, Carnes Naturales SPA operates in an industry in which biodiversity impact is a material environmental issue.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Approximately 100% supplier expenses come directly from animal farms.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	Animal agriculture poses a risk to local ecosystems of flora and fauna as well as the potential degradation of farmed land.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	The company sources meat from farms that operate in a regenerative way. They do not use chemical fertilizers and any type of agrochemical in general with a focus on soil biodiversity and the relationship to the pasture and the animals. The farms do not practice soil tillage, in order to encourage soil development. The farmers do not use antibiotics, hormones or medications with their animals. The manure from the animals is therefore, not ""toxic"" for the soil since they do not contain strong components that impair their absorption. The micro-organisms are capable of using feces as a natural fertilizer. The company has set the objective to be able to make a quantitative impact of what it means to
	produce a kilo of meat under this system in the next year.
OTHER MANAGEMENT COMMENTS	Companies that do the same management as us (regenerative pasture management) have already managed to analyze this and have been able to reach the conclusion that for every kilo of meat produced in their systems they are removing 3 kilos of CO2 from the atmosphere, breaking all the productive myths associated with livestock production. SUMMARY OF ISSUE	As a meat manufacturer, Carnes Naturales SPA operates in an industry that is water intensive.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Approximately 100% supplier expenses come directly from animal farms.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	The main source of water used is rainwater that falls in southern Chile. This is used in the meadows to produce naturally irrigated pastures. The surplus or running water is stored in artificial dams and is user in the water troughs of the animals, when they do not have direct access to a stream or storage ponds.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	The company does not pay for water as they utilise rainwater and do not extract any water from the ground. The company does not benchmark their water intensity against players in the same sector. As part of the regenerative farming system, the soil is able to properly absorb the rainwater, as opposed to under developed soil that results in run off.

TOPIC	Carnes Naturales SPA is a meat manufacturer and sources >50% of their supplier expenses from animal farms.
SUMMARY OF ISSUE	Company sources meat from a variety of different animal farms - cattle, goats, sheep and ducks. The cattle are grass fed and raised outdoors. Transport is reduced which reduces stress - this thanks to the fact that the fields are very close to the slaughter plant. The cows, pigs, sheep, chickens, and fish are raised freely, representing 96% of total products sold. The ducks are in pens. The pens are 4x the size of the minimum requirement for ducks.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	The average size of the cattle farm is 200 cattle. The farms range in size from 25-40 acres.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	Animals that are raised for agriculture must be humanely handled to ensure no unnecessary suffering. Animal welfare experts advocate for animals raised for agriculture to have access to the five freedoms.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	The company schedules visits to see the handling and production practices of their supplier farms, which they share on their social networks so that their clients can see how each producer is being monitored.
	The company has not set any KPIs around their animal welfare to date. The company sources cattle from regenerative farms that are raised on pasture and are not given hormones or antibiotics.

IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	The company sources meat from cattle raised on regenerative farms which they state are able to sequester more carbon than they emit. The company has attached a report on this topic. The company has EOV certification, Ecological Outcome Verification - https://savory.global/land-to-market/eov/. They look to prove that they consider the entire production system, the soil, the pasture and the animals, which can be used as a whole to reduce the equivalent CO2 emitted by this industry. The company has not set any targets around carbon reduction.
