Disclosure Questionnaire Statement

Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Industries at risk for human rights violations

Topic	Company sources metal precious and diamonds
Summary of Issue	Loft & Daughter is a jewelry retailer and manufacturer whose products utilize precious metals and precious gemstones. These raw materials could be considered conflict minerals and pose a potential human rights risk.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Approximately 88.8% of the company's Cost of Goods Sold comes from materials that would be considered a high risk for human rights violations.
Impact on Stakeholders	The use of precious metals and gemstones poses a human rights risk due to the possibility that they are sourced from conflict-affected and high risk areas, where they may be used to finance conflict and/or be associated with human rights abuses in the supply chain.
Implemented Management Practices	Based on FY22, approximately 93% of the company's supplier expenses were with WFTO (World Fair Trade Organisation) and FTFI (Fair Trade Forum India) certified suppliers.
	Loft & Daughter has a supplier code of conduct establishing minimum expectations regarding human rights, business ethics and labor rights for their suppliers. 100% of the company's current suppliers have signed the code of conduct. Loft & Daughter's suppliers are also subject to compliance checks, which can include monitoring, on-site visits, interviews of employed artisans and third party certifications.
Other Management Comments	Since starting my brand and working in jewelry, I have been hyper aware of the importance of working towards a traceable supply chain due to the potential human rights risks posed by the mining of precious metals. I am proud to work with my small fair trade jewelry partner & their shared passion for alleviating poverty and empowering disadvantaged craftspeople. I am also proud to produce in small, unwasteful batches. However, both present their challenges with regards to the availability of traceable materials, and are without doubt, the biggest



challenge faced by Loft & Daughter. My sustainability journey is an ongoing process and I will make the switch to more sustainable, ethical, and traceable materials when they become available to my producer in India & for small batch production.
