Торіс	Layoffs due to COVID-19 pandemic
Summary of Issue	 Harmless Harvest is a Danone company. The scope of Harmless Harvest's B Corp Certification encompasses the following entities: Harmless Harvest USA, Harmless Harvest (Thailand) Co., Ltd. During the pandemic, Harmless Harvest USA laid off employees whose jobs required them to visit stores in person. Since there were stay-at-home orders and stores were not allowing in-person visitors, they were not able to complete any work.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	12 employees were laid off, representing 21% of the company's employees at that time.
Impact on Stakeholders	Primary impact was loss of employment for affected employees.
Management Practices	The company made efforts to keep employees employed by furloughing them starting in April 2020. During the furlough period, Harmless Harvest continued to provide these employees health insurance, gave guidance on how to apply for unemployment benefits, and made employees' pay whole by filling in the gap where unemployment benefits fell short. All of the above-described steps were taken to bring these individuals back to work at Harmless Harvest. Ultimately, the pandemic continued and the company was forced to lay these individuals off in June of 2020. All individuals laid off were given severance.

Summary of Issue	Harmless Harvest is involved in the production of plant-based food & beverage products and therefore is a part of an industry that can potentially be classified as energy and emission-intensive, meaning that they are more likely to have significant impacts on the environment based on their carbon emissions associated with their operations and their contribution to climate change. Harmless Harvest acknowledges its potential negative environmental impact and actively works to mitigate its impact.
	As per B Lab's rules, manufacturing companies in the food & beverage industry are required to make transparent their involvement in such activities or industries, irrespective of their actual intensity or impact.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In 2023, 100% of Harmless Harvest's revenue was derived from the manufacturing and sale of plant-based food & beverage products. Harmless Harvest's energy-intensive activities are mostly related to the company's manufacturing site located in Thailand (energy demands of the production process but also indirect emissions of upstream and downstream activities in the supply chain: methane emissions associated with coconut farming practices, coconut husk management, transportation, etc.).
	The company's key contribution to Greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions are indirect GHG emissions generated from agriculture and waste management.
	Total GHG Emissions in 2023 = 125,512 tCO2e - Scope 1: 756 tCO2e - Scope 2: 5,717 tCO2e - Scope 3: 119,039 tCO2e
Impact on Stakeholders	Energy-intensive activities, such as food & beverage manufacturing, pose an environmental risk due to the related emissions derived from energy use. The extent of environmental impact depends on the energy sources utilised and the management practices in place to manage energy use.
Management Practices	The company has taken steps to : - increase energy efficiency in their operations, - increase the share of renewable energy sources, - phase out coconut husk to landfill (by supplying them to an upcycling fiber production), - explore low-carbon farm waste management,
	The company conducts GHG inventories (in line with the Greenhouse Gas Protocol methodologies) to monitor and reduce emissions over time. Energy consumption is regularly monitored to identify areas for improvement, and the company is exploring investing in solar power in the coming years.
	Harmless Harvest is committed to reaching carbon neutrality by 2030. The company annually studies the sources of their greenhouse gas emissions and

	has found that their biggest emitters are: coconut farming and coconut waste. These two sources alone make up more than 75% of the company's total brand emissions. Learning about the sources of their emissions has informed their sustainability roadmap for 2030 and beyond. To reach the goal of achieving carbon neutrality by 2030, Harmless Harvest plans to : - achieve and maintain 100% Nam Hom coconuts sourced from farms that utilize regenerative organic practices as business & volumes grow, - achieve circularity on farms (zero coconut waste from the factory to landfill), - evolve packaging materials to meet best-in-class climate standards (including reusable, recyclable or compostable), - and transition to 100% renewable energy in owned operations.

Summary of Issue	Harmless Harvest is involved in the manufacturing and sale of plant-based food & beverage products and because of that can potentially be classified as water-intensive, meaning that they are more likely to have significant impacts on the environment based on the water consumption associated with their operations and their potential contribution to water scarcity. Harmless Harvest acknowledges its potential negative environmental impact and actively works to mitigate its impact.
	As per B Lab's rules, manufacturing companies in the food & beverage industry are required to make transparent their involvement in such activities or industries, irrespective of their actual intensity or impact.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In 2023, 100% of Harmless Harvest's revenue was derived from the manufacturing and sale of plant-based food & beverage products. The company's water-intensive activities are mostly related to the operations on the manufacturing site located in Thailand.
	In 2023, the factory production's water usage slightly exceeded 300 million liters, with 100% of the water sourced from groundwater. Harmless Harvest Thailand complies with the <u>Groundwater Act, B.E. 2520</u> (<u>1977</u>). The Act was enforced to control groundwater licensing, groundwater utilization, and water infiltration to the wells in order to protect groundwater quantity and quality. In Thailand, factories that utilize groundwater are required to comply with regulations set by the <u>Ministry of Natural Resources and</u> <u>Environment (MNRE)</u> under the Groundwater Act. The ministry issues groundwater licenses that stipulate the appropriate amount of water a facility is allowed to extract. This prevents the likelihood of conflicts over water access with local communities.
Impact on Stakeholders	As a water-intensive industry, the sale and/or manufacturing of food & beverage products poses risks such as water stress or depletion of local water sources if water used is not appropriately managed.
Management Practices	The company is in the early stages of exploring water efficiency initiatives. The company monitors its water consumption and is working toward integrating water conservation practices into their core operations by exploring effective water-saving practices and evaluating water recycling technologies. In addition, the company recognizes the importance of incorporating upstream activities into their water conservation strategies for a more holistic approach. That is why they are working toward collaborating with farmers to implement sustainable water management strategies at the farm level to reduce overall water consumption in their value chain.
Management Comments	"Harmless Harvest is committed to improving water efficiency and ensuring sustainable use in collaboration with local stakeholders. The company's long-term goal is to adopt a more comprehensive approach and set clear reduction targets; to ensure that water management efforts are both effective

and aligned with their broader environmental objectives"

Summary of Issue	Harmless Harvest (Thailand) Co., Ltd. is involved in the production and sale of plant-based products and operates in an industry in which biodiversity impact can be a material environmental issue. The company's portfolio predominantly relies on a single commodity—coconut, which is cultivated in Thailand. Coconut is typically grown in monoculture. This agricultural practice can affect sustainable land use and have social implications.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Approximately, 57% of Harmless Harvest (Thailand) supplier expenses come directly from coconut farms.
Impact on Stakeholders	Agriculture can pose a risk to local ecosystems of flora and fauna as well as the potential degradation of cultivated land.
Management Practices	Harmless Harvest established a comprehensive set of measures to ensure farmers' compliance with regenerative practices. These include regular on-site inspections and periodic audits conducted by accredited third-party organizations to verify adherence to its standards (namely Organic certificate, Regenerative Organic Certified Standard, and Fair For Life standard). To further support compliance, the company provides ongoing capacity-building initiatives and training sessions focused on regenerative agriculture techniques.
	The company is committed to sourcing 100% of its coconuts from Regenerative Organic Certified farms by 2030. By transitioning fully to regenerative sourcing, Harmless Harvest aims to improve soil health, increase biodiversity, enhance carbon sequestration, and support resilient farming communities. The company's roadmap to 2030 includes partnering closely with farmers to implement regenerative practices, providing training and supports to ensure continuous progress toward this goal. Since 2023, all coconuts purchased by the company are Regenerative Organic Certified® at Bronze Level.
	Harmless Harvest is committed to implementing regenerative agricultural practices throughout its supply chain. It offers training and support on techniques such as cover cropping and introducing alternative plants for intercropping. This helps farmers maintain crop yields while protecting biodiversity. The implementation of these practices is regularly inspected, through the aforementioned third-party audits. Additionally, it prioritizes the use of organic alternatives throughout our supply chain and closely monitors pesticide and chemical fertilizer use among its suppliers. 100% of its products are USDA Organic certified, which means they are produced without synthetic pesticides, chemical fertilizers, or other prohibited substances. This certification ensures that its farming practices meet stringent organic standards, promoting both product purity and environmental sustainability.
