Summary of Issue	Pyrrha is a Canadian based company which manufactures handcrafted jewellery using 100% recycled precious metals, including silver, gold, diamonds, and coloured gemstones.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	<ul> <li>- 0% of the company's raw material inputs are mined precious metals or stones.</li> <li>- 100% of the Pyrrha's revenue comes from the sale of jewellery products</li> <li>- Around 77% of the company's suppliers have officially signed the Supplier Code of Conduct.</li> </ul>
Impact on Stakeholders	The use of precious metals and gemstones poses a human rights risk due to the possibility that they are sourced from conflict-affected and high-risk areas, where they may be used to finance conflict and/or be associated with human rights abuses in the supply chain.
	B Lab has flagged the jewelry industry as a material issue and new standards will be created to address possible risks related to this matter. Should the Standards Advisory Council determine specific performance requirements for companies in this industry, Pyrrha would be required to meet these standards by a future recertification date.
Implemented Management Practices	Pyrrha is certified by the Responsible Jewellery Council (RJC) and received an in person audit in September 2022, awarding the company a 3-year certification. This Certification covers responsible supply chains and human rights, labour rights and working conditions, health, safety and environmental matters to gold, silver, PGM, diamond and coloured gemstone products.
	<ul> <li>The company's recycled precious metal supplies are purchased from Umicore Precious Metals Canada:</li> <li>Their gold and silver are certified by the LBMA and Butterfly Mark</li> <li>They are members of the Responsible Jewellery Council and the OECD Due Diligence Guidance for the Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and high- Risk Areas.</li> </ul>

	Pyrrha has a Responsible Businesses Policy (link below) and Supply Chain Policy (link below) in place with regards to the sourcing of their gold, silver, diamonds and coloured gemstones used in production. The company has established a system of controls and transparency over its supply chain for the purchase of these resources, aligning with the Code of Practice guidelines from the Responsible Jewellery Council and the OECD Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High- Risk Areas. Due diligence on suppliers is carried out upon identifying a new supplier; suppliers receive the company's Supplier Code of Conduct and are required to review and sign it. The Supplier Code of Conduct outlines Pyrrha's expectations for business partners in relation to human rights (e.g. working conditions and prohibition of child labour, harassment and discrimination) and the environment. Suppliers are required to complete a Code of Conduct Questionnaire and the KYC Questionnaire requesting specific information related to the supplier's business practices and ownership.Pyrrha's mechanisms for carrying out due diligence report available on their website (2022 reportlink below). In addition, Pyrrha is a Butterfly Mark Certified member of Positive Luxury (link below), a Certification programme offered to companies selling luxury products, including an ESG+ assessment, risk and opportunity mapping as well as a transition strategy and verification through certification.
