Summary of Issue	Kerv Group has clients in the following industries: Offensive Firearms/Weapons/Defence, Gambling, Mining, Nuclear Power or Radioactive Materials and Pharmaceuticals
	The types of services/products offered to these clients are related to Digital Transformation Solutions including: - Utility-based compute re-sale, - Provision of software licensing and communication tools for customer support and contact centres (Specialist, but off-the-shelf, licensing resale), - Delivery of tailored consultancy services in cybersecurity, digital transformation, and service management to optimize operational efficiency. - Development of specialized software solutions for presales activities and technical specifications in industries like mining.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In FY24 , 0.49% of the company's annual revenue was from clients in the Gambling industry, 0.14% from clients in the Offensive Firearms/ Weapons/Defence industry, 0.01% from clients in the Mining industry, 0.18% from clients operating in the Nuclear Power or Radioactive Materials industry, and 0.10% from the Pharmaceuticals industry.
	In FY25 , 0.01% of the company's annual revenue was from clients in the Gambling industry, 0.35% from clients in the Offensive Firearms/ Weapons/Defence industry, 0.01% from clients in the Mining industry, 0.14% from clients operating in the Nuclear Power or Radioactive Materials industry, and 0.13% from the Pharmaceuticals industry.
Impact on Stakeholder(s)	Companies that work with clients in controversial industries can directly or indirectly increase the harmful impact to stakeholders by enabling business growth. Therefore, companies that work with clients in these industries should have practices in place to ensure that their impact is aimed at decreasing the negative impacts of the industry.
	Companies offering certain types of services and products to



	controversial clients are required to have at minimum a grievance/complaints mechanism and a whistleblower protection policy.
Implemented Management Practices	B Lab has been able to verify that the company has the necessary mechanisms in place to manage the risks related to their business relationships with clients in controversial and ineligible industries, in line with B Lab's requirements (see link below). This includes: - A mechanism for internal and external stakeholders to raise grievances; - A policy that is shared with individuals who raise a grievance, containing information related to the grounds for accepting a grievance and how their grievance will be dealt with, as well as related timelines; - A Whistleblower Policy that establishes the company's commitment to protecting whistleblower identity as well as the processes and controls in place to protect stakeholders who raise grievances from any form of retaliation.

Management Comments	We are intentional about customers - We care about who we work with, however we don't immediately discount a customer because they are in a controversial industry - We consider carefully the impact of our engagement and opportunity for positive impact, for example, in defence our work is home-territory cyber security hardening - helping protect UK systems from foreign cyber espionage (again we believe not directly Contributing) Internally, we also: - Place new potential customers and statements of work with Clients in Controversial Industries under additional scrutiny (inc. at times altered contractual terms) - We train staff on this discipline, and it's a part of our weekly standing GovOps agenda - Limit proposal approval for Clients in Controversial Industries



to the Group Senior Management Team (on our Limits of Authority Matrix)

- Review customers in all Controversial Industries listed by B Lab, not just those in-scope for Pathway #2 (e.g. regardless of whether relevant to Clients-In, and whether they are direct customers or not)
- Where we engage, we specifically consider the risks of contributing to negative impacts and identify appropriate mitigating controls
- Regularly compile data on our exposure, including forecasting (to avoid breaching limits)
- We now calculate using posted-invoice (opposed to recognised revenue), further tightening our internal benchmark, and increasing transparency/ speed of compilation

In our 2025 impact report we are working to include:

- Details of how we assure the scope of who we work with
- Metrics on the scale of engagement (both clients-in and purpose driven enterprises)
