## **Disclosure Questionnaire Statement**

Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Environmentally Intensive Industries - Chemical Intensive Industries/Hazardous materials

Topic	Chemical Intensive Industries/Hazardous materials
Summary of Issue	As a company that produces candles, Patagonia Candles operates in an industry in which chemical use is a material environmental issue.
	<ul> <li>The company reported the following hazardous substances originated from the candle production process:</li> <li>Remains of mineral oils not suitable for their original use, that is, rags or papers stained with essences that arise from the process,</li> <li>Rest of anilines or solvents which are not suitable for their original use, they are dyes or pigments that are used to bathe incense or give color to candles. As in the previous case, rags, papers, and container drums stained with this substance are discarded,</li> <li>Paraffin or soy waxes, which can fall on the floor or on rags/paper that are already mixed with oils or anilines.</li> </ul>
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Within the candle product line, there is an active shift in the formulation process to increase the proportion of soy candles. In the year 2022, soy candles constituted 27% of the overall production.  The revenue is divided in 3 different groups:  1-Candles 33.35%  2-Scented products 59.27%  3-Deco/Home 7.38%
Impact on Stakeholders	The production of candles involves the use of chemicals, which, if not appropriately managed, pose risks to the environment such as pollution of air, land, and water, as well as potential human health risks to those exposed to harmful chemicals.
Implemented Management Practices	Patagonia Candles shared the following practices to mitigate the risks associated with hazardous substances that result in its production process:
	(1) The company has a formal procedure in place to manage its



hazardous materials and to manage waste overall:

- The policy specifies which materials are considered hazardous, how they are separated, stored, transported out of the company and treated,
- Employees are trained on how to properly handle those materials,
- The policy is aligned with guidance determined by the Ministry of Environment.
- (2) The company's supplier, which is responsible for the transportation and disposal/treatment of hazardous materials, has a certificate for hazardous waste treatment, emitted by the Ministry of Environment and Sustainable Development, demonstrating it has the license to provide those services,
- (3) The company submitted a lab test of its emissions to show it is compliant with the maximum thresholds permitted,
- (4) The company provided evidence for inspections done by Aysa (Agua y Saneamentos Argentinos) on 2019 and 2021.
