Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

- Intentional misrepresentation of practices, policies, and/or claimed outcomes during the company's certification process

Disclosure Questionnaire Statement

Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Litigation, Arbitration and Penalties

Issue Date	2019-2023
Topic	Litigations related to the termination of distribution agreement.
Summary of Issue	Danone Nutricia Africa is a subsidiary of Danone that is pursuing independent certification. The certification consists of two assessments/BIAs: - BIA 1: Danone Nutricia Africa & Overseas - BIA 2: Danone Nutricia Cote d' Ivoire & Nutricia Southern Africa (South Africa). In the last five years, Danone Nutricia Africa & Overseas had two (2) litigation cases related to disputes of distribution agreements. Case 1 (2019) involves a distributor seeking compensation related to the termination of a longstanding distribution relationship before the Lyon commercial court. Case 2 (2022) involves a commercial litigation in the court of Amsterdam (the NL) with a distributor regarding the termination of the distribution agreement (partially and entirely), grounds for it and potential losses of the distributor caused by the termination.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Case 1 - EUR 9,124,208.94 incl. interest as per the first instance decision Case 2 - Net profit of the distributor earned during the years 2020 and 2021 (estimate exposure to be largely below 10M EURO which is distributor's gross profit and subject to a final court decision).
Impact on Stakeholders	The main stakeholders affected are Danone's distributors having commercial contract agreements with Danone Nutricia Africa.
Resolution	Case 1 - In December 2022, the Lyon commercial court ruled in favor of the distributor, ordering Danone to pay a specified compensatory amount. The court decision is currently being appealed. Case 2- The interlocutory judgment to compensate losses to the distributor is rendered on March 6th upon which damages to the distributor shall be compensated. Calculation of damages and final judgment on the amount are to come later this year.
Management Practices	Process for assessing termination of distribution agreements: The company has developed a process to assess the potential impact of terminating a distribution relationship, and apply optimal timing and method for termination Training and Awareness: The company has implemented training for the relevant functions on contract management and termination of the relationship with distributors.
