Торіс	Company has operations in conflict affected countries
Summary of Issue	Delft Imaging supplies imaging equipment and artificial intelligence and provides training for these solutions to multiple countries across the world, including the following countries: Afghanistan, Syria, Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), Iraq, Sudan, Ethiopia, Libya, Nigeria, Chad, Lebanon, Palestine, Yemen, Azerbaijan, Burkina Faso, Guinea-Bissau , Mali, Mozambique, Niger, Nigeria, Pakistan, Timor-Leste and Zimbabwe. These countries are considered fragile and conflict-affected areas according to the FY2024 List of Fragile and Conflict-affected Situations and Global Conflict Tracker.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the FY2023, 83% of the company's revenue came from operations in conflict affected countries, including: Afghanistan, Syria, Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), Iraq, Sudan, Ethiopia, Libya, Nigeria, Chad, Lebanon, Palestine, Yemen, Azerbaijan, Burkina Faso, Guinea-Bissau, Mali, Mozambique, Niger, Nigeria, Pakistan, Timor-Leste and Zimbabwe.
Impact on Stakeholders	Business activities located in conflict zones are considered high-risk as they are more likely to cause or contribute to the conflict and/or sociopolitical instability. Countries classified as conflict zones are more likely to have a weak rule-of-law or a corrupt judicial system, which could undermine the effectiveness of operational grievance mechanisms for these businesses and their suppliers. In addition, the safety of the company's collaborators and other potential human rights violations are potentially at risk.
Implemented Management Practices	The company is aware of these potential risks that could potentially affect its work and has a variety of good management practices in place relevant to this scope (e.g. Anti-Corruption clauses in its contracts with local partners) and has relevant internal policies and training for its personnel. The medical solutions are mostly procured through UN(-related)

	organizations, which in itself also have good management practices in place to prevent corruption and unlawful practices and to ensure that there are no ties to any conflict itself.
Report	Annual Impact Reports
Management Comments	Delft Imaging is a social impact company in the healthcare field. Our specialization in tuberculosis screening and maternal health brings us frequently to countries identified as conflict zones, because of the health burden these countries face. We believe that while these countries can pose various challenges, these are also the countries where our solutions can have the biggest possible impact.
	Because our portfolio of solutions aims to eradicate tuberculosis and helps strengthen local healthcare systems, it only positively impacts the living situation in conflict-burdened areas. The nature of our business - health - does not in anyway contribute to conflict or instability, but rather contributes positively to the living situation of the local population of these countries. Moreover, the majority of procurement of our solutions is via United nations (and UN-associated) organizations such as the International Organization for Migration (IOM), whose activities are also in these conflict-burdened areas. These organizations also strive with us for the same goals: the eradication of tuberculosis and the strengthening of health systems. These organizations also have extensive procedures and policies in place to validate the quality of goods that are to be procured, as well as the fairness of these processes through which these are procured.
