SUMMARY OF ISSUE	As a distillery, Cape Byron Distillery operates in an industry that is water intensive.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the previous fiscaly year, 90% of company revenue was earned from the sale of alcohol
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	"As a water intensive industry, distilling poses risks such as water stress or depletion of local water sources if water use is not appropriately managed. Cape Byron Distillery's main source of water comes from their roof top rainwater catchment on the property, this accounts for over 95% of their day to day water. They also purchase water from the local supply when necessary, and a small amount of water is also purchased from Mount Warning Spring Water to blend with their spirits.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	"The company installed a water catchment system and have recently purchased more tanks to catch water off all roofs on their property which also forms part of their reduction targets. Furthermore, they are seeking to return all waste water from their production process back to the water table in their region through their on site waste water management system. They have also working to eliminate the need to use the town water in the event of dry periods. They have begun upscaling their water catchment setup at the distillery to maximise that water catchment on their roofs. The installation of new tanks will keep up with increased demands while keeping them 100% off the grid for day to day water use They don't conduct any formal comparisons with other companies in their industry believe that using a system that operates 100% off grid for water is above the norm."

IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	"The company complies with all the regulations and laws related to the sale of alcohol in the jurisdictions where they operate. They have opted in to including warnings on their packaging although they are not required by law, simply ""best practice"". They ensure that all their advertising encourages responsible alcohol consumption where appropriate. They will never imply that alcohol is healthy nor should it be consumed in large quantities."

TOPIC	Company has their distillery located on the Brooke family's Macadamia orchard.
SUMMARY OF ISSUE	This forest is considered sensitive given the rarity of sections of forest like it. The remnant forests of the original "Big Scrub" forest are currently roughly 1% of its original coverage. As the entire forest is located on private land, it does not hold any protected classifications.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Their distillery encompassess roughly 1% of the total property. Roughly 95% of production in terms of volume occurs in the facilities located there.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	Potential risks could include pollution from chemicals, runoff water or sewerage - all of these potentials have been eliminated
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	Cape Byron Distillery has reduced the chemicals being used through the instillation of their Klarion system. All chemical removals or disposals follow all government standards and are regularly reviewed in house to seek improvement on an ongoing basis. They have a built for purpose sewerage system and wastewater system whereby all wastewater from the building (from production, toilets etc.) is processed through a multistage, natural process system. This system has been deliberately over engineered to ensure that they never reach capacity or run the risk of overloading their system. They are also currently in the process of reviewing their system and are looking to invest in a larger one to enable growth. Furthermore, deliberate planting has been done around the building to catch and slow the flow of any excess stormwater that might run off from the building, some of these include Native Lomandra that act like a natural filter.
