Topic	Labor issues
Summary of Issue	In the last 5 years, the company has had four litigation cases related to labor issues. Three of them are related to wrongful termination. One is a class action/PAGA lawsuit for overtime, meal period and other related wage violations.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	2 wrongful termination cases are still pending. 1 case settled with a payment of \$30,000 to avoid further litigation, which is less than 1% of the company's revenue. The class action was settled with a payment of \$300,000, which is less than 1% of the company's revenue. The class size is 1,029 class members of former and current employees.
Impact on Stakeholders	Wages violations and wrongful terminations can negatively impact the finances, well-being and health of employees, former-employees and their families.
Resolution	2 cases are pending resolution. 2 cases were settled out of court.
Implemented Management Practices	The company has an active training program for managers to appropriately manage performance including progressive discipline, 1:1 feedback, and 9 Box method to properly identify and document poor performers. Avocado has a labor management system within the payroll that automates break premiums according to California wage and hour law. The company also runs regular audits of punches, authorize "mobile punches" via app for select remote positions.

Summary of Issue	Avocado Green Brands has a mattress manufacturing wing that manufactures products including mattresses, pillows, and other home furnishings. Manufacturing is an energy and emissions intensive industry.

	The company is also heavily involved in policy advocacy to support climate action legislation and sustainable business practice. Through these efforts, the company hopes to impact its scope 3 carbon emissions.
Management Comments	The results of the 2019 LCA showed that Avocado Green Brands has a 40% reduction in environmental impact compared to the industry average. Further, the company is the first mattress brand to be a Certified Carbon Neutral company.
