Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Other disclosures

Topic	Negative PR
Summary of Issue	Media reports have highlighted differences between Climate Adviser Trust (CAT), a legally independent non-profit affiliate of Climate Advisers Inc, the B Corporation, and the Norwegian Ministry for International Development (Norad) over transparency and conflicts of interest. CAT and Norad resolved their differences amicably. CAT denies wrongdoing and maintains that Norad was aware of the arrangements and that the goals were met.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	The project mentioned accounts for approximately 15% of the company's average annual revenues over the past seven years. Specifically, in the year when negative PR surfaced, it represented approximately 29% of the revenue.
Impact on Stakeholder(s)	Alleged mismanagement of climate aid funds and lack of transparency may result in reputational damage, reduced trust from donors, and negative impacts on the effectiveness of programs benefiting local communities.
Implemented Management Practices	At this time, there are no legal implications related to these allegations.
	To prevent any perception of a conflict of interest or an inappropriate relationship between the two entities, Climate Advisers Inc. has voluntarily chosen to stop accepting funds from its non-profit affiliate, Climate Advisers Trust. This policy has been in place for several years, and there have been no subsequent negative public relations issues.
Report	Collaboration ended in a multimillion dollar dispute Norwegian aid to Climate Advisers ends in "multimillion-dollar dispute"
Other Management Comments	Climate Advisers Inc had several projects with Norad over a decade, and none were disputed. The misunderstanding between CAT and NORAD arose over the relationship between CAT and Climate Advisers Inc, two separate legal entities. All deliverables were met, and the project was completed. All funds were property accounted for. At project close, 2.5% of the grant



was returned to Norad as unspent funds.

Norad's dispute was with Climate Advisers Trust (CAT), which is a legally independent organization from Climate Advisers Inc. The decisions made by CAT that led to the misunderstanding with Norad were determined by CAT's independent Board of Directors, none of whom are employees or shareholders of Climate Advisers Inc. CAT asserts that it acted appropriately, and the company believes this to be true. However, if mistakes were made, it would be unjust to hold Climate Advisers Inc. responsible for the decisions made by CAT and its Board. The negative public relations occurred before Norad and CAT reached a mutually acceptable resolution. At no time were formal complaints or legal actions initiated against CAT. Furthermore, Norad did not make any accusations against Climate Advisers Inc.
