

DISCLOSURE MATERIALS

SUMMARY OF ISSUE	The textile industry is water intensive. The use of water is fundamental for the processing steps of preparation, desizing, bleaching and dyeing.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the previous fiscal year, 40% of Limebranch Pty. Ltd. revenue was earned from the sales of Full Circle Fibres' fabric and yarns. Full Circle Fibres estimates their total water consumption is approximately 2,900 L/kg in total for fibre growing and dyeing in total.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	As water intensive industries, textile production poses risks such as water stress or depletion of local water sources if water use is not appropriately managed.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	Limebranch's Full Circle Fibres business manages its water footprint by using what they call ""slow clothing"" approach. This means that they avoid oversupply and overproduction of their products, resulting in less wasted materials and resources. The company partners directly with all supplier factories and service providers, with complete line of sight through every stage back to the farm, that allows them to have this flexibility and control in their supply chain. This approach mitigates the risk of unknown processing methods, and the risks of waste production to avoid deadstock. Full Circle Fibres uses locally grown cotton in their production, which can also be water intensive. Given that, they have chosen to partner with Australian Super Cotton, a farm that measures producing cotton with approximately 70% less water than the commonly quoted global cotton industry averages. Dyeing is the other water intensive part of textiles supply. Full Circle Fibres works with local dyehouses that offer flexible batch sizes and collaborative arrangements to hold undyed fabric and yarn in place in order to respond to customers requirements on demand. This process saves water by only producing what is being demanded by consumers. Full Circle Fibres estimates their total water consumption is approximately 2,900 L/kg in total for fibre growing and dyeing in total, in comparison with often quoted global averages of approximately 10,000 L/kg.
