SUMMARY OF ISSUE	As a food processing company, Destination operates in an energy intensive industry with coffee roasting and transportation being the most energy intensive processes in their operations.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	82% of Destination's onsite energy consumption is from gas consumption which is utilized for coffee roasting and the rest is from electricity consumption. Their products required an average 822 kWh of energy (gas + electricity) per tonne of production in 2019. Destination has not benchmarked their energy intensity with that of their peers.
	Energy intensity of transportation has not yet been quantified, although Destination has identified transportation as the primary contributor to their carbon footprint.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDER(S)	The carbon emissions associated with their operations and their contribution to climate change along with air pollution and associated health impacts of air quality are the potential impacts of their energy intensity.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	Destination has set a target to be carbon neutral for 2025 and tracks progress against this goal. They have installed energy meters on site to be able to understand their facilities' energy consumption.
	For their gas consumption, Destination has set a target of reducing their gas consumption per tonne of product manafactured by 5% as also switching to 100% biogas as soon as possible.
	For electricity consumption, Destination has undertaken various projects such as switching to energy efficient equipment like LED lights, compressors with variable speed drive, energy efficient air conditioning and moving to an energy efficient building in the coming years. The company is also undertaking a project to switch to air conditioning models that utilize R32 refrigerant with a lower global warming potential when compared to R410A refrigerant.
	As for their off-site carbon emissions from transportation, Destination is undertaking initiatives such as avoiding long routes, utilizing local transport actors that focus on carbon emissions as well as optimising their cargo shipments.
