

DISCLOSURE MATERIALS

Certified B Corporations must complete a Disclosure Questionnaire to identify potentially sensitive issues related to the company (e.g. historical fines, sanctions, material litigation, or sensitive industry practices).

This component does not affect the company's score on the B Impact Assessment. If the company answers affirmatively to any items in the Disclosure Questionnaire and B Lab deems them to be material, the company must:

- 1) Be transparent about the disclosure issues identified on the company's public B Impact Report
- 2) Describe how the company has addressed this issue.
- 3) Demonstrate that management systems are in place to avoid similar issues from arising in the future.

In all cases, the Standards Advisory council reserves the right to refuse certification if the company is ultimately deemed not to uphold the spirit of the community.

In addition to the voluntary indication of sensitive issues in the Disclosure Questionnaire, companies pursuing Certification also are subject to background checks by B Lab staff. Background checks include a review of public records, news sources, and search engines for company names, brands, executives/founders, and other relevant topics.

Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

| TOPIC | Company operates an animal farm and has direct control over the treatment of animals in its care. |
| SUMMARY OF ISSUE | Sharpham raises cows and goats on its farmland. The company employs a mixed farming system in which the cows graze outside for as long as the land and weather permits. The company meets the standards required for Red Tractor and Arla Garden qualification. |
| SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected) | Sharpham owns 65 Jersey cows and 50 goats. The company also purchases cow milk, sheeps milk, and goats milk from other farms. |
| IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS | Large dairy operations can have adverse impacts on the environment (e.g., greenhouse gas emissions due to high methane concentration) and animal welfare concerns due to large number of cows being confined or not able to express normal behaviors. |
| IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES | "Sharpham meets Red Tractor standards. Red Tractor is the UK's largest food and farming scheme, and its standards cover the entire food supply chain. Red Tractor's Dairy Standards can be found here and include proper training of farm workers; hygenic milk collection and storage; and safe, comfortable, and hygenic housing for cows. Sharpham also meets Arlagarden standards. Arla is committed to sustainable dairy production, and its farm management program is called Arlagarden. Arlagarden's standards can be found here and include milk quality and food safety; animal welfare; climate and nature; and people." |

| IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS | As a water intensive industry, animal agriculture poses risks such as water stress or depletion of local water sources if water use is not appropriately managed. The company does not operate in water stressed areas. |
| IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES | The company relies primarily on natural rainfall. Approximately 16% of their water needs are met through dyke irrigation. The company captures allwater and whey from production and reuses it as fertilizers. The company is working on creating timebound targets for increased recycle and reuse of water and plans to have a formalized strategy by year-end 2022. |

The company is planning on becoming 90% self-sufficient for feed by year-end 2022. Hedges are cut every two years in order to encourage biodiversity. The company's use of pesticides and fertilizer is minimal. |
