Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Fossil Fuels

Topic	Fossil Fuel Usage in Aviation
Summary of Issue	Heritage Aviation operates in the aircraft industry and engages in the sale of aviation fuel along with their aircraft maintenance and avionics services.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the last fiscal year, 38.8% of the company's revenues were from the sale of aviation fuel.
Impact on Stakeholders	Fossil Fuel usage has a significant impact on air pollution. Fossil fuels can cause acid rain, eutrophication (excessive nutrients that can harm aquatic ecosystems by lowering oxygen levels), damage to crops and forests, and harm to wildlife. Fossil fuels can also cause water pollution from oil spills to fracking fluids.
	By its next recertification cycle, Heritage Aviation will be required to comply with all applicable requirements in effect at that time.
Resolution	Heritage Aviation undertook an initiative to identify its carbon reduction objectives, which now guide both its short- and long-term priorities. The company continues to monitor its carbon footprint and achieved a reduction of 56.8 metric tons (CO2e) from 2022 to 2023. Specifically, its Scope 1 and 2 emissions decreased from 924.7 to 867.9 metric tons (CO2e). When factoring in carbon offsets, the total footprint was reduced to 135.6 metric tons (CO2e). Heritage Aviation remains committed to measuring its emissions and plans to include Scope 3 emissions in its 2024 reporting. Through a combination of internal reduction strategies and offsets, the company aims to achieve net zero emissions by the end of 2027. Additionally, as part of its sustainability efforts in aviation fuel sales, Heritage Aviation transitioned to Avfuel, a supplier recognized for its leadership in sustainability and its offering of sustainable aviation fuel (SAF), a non-fossil fuel alternative.
Implemented Management Practices	Heritage Aviation continues to take a proactive approach toward minimizing its environmental impact and adopting new technologies to reduce its carbon footprint. Notable progress



has been made in the area of aviation fuel sales, particularly with the upcoming availability of Sustainable Aviation Fuel (SAF). SAF, which is derived from non-fossil fuel feedstocks, has the potential to reduce net greenhouse gas emissions by up to 90% over its full life cycle when compared to conventional fossil-based jet fuel. Heritage Aviation is working closely with its fuel supplier to begin receiving SAF shipments, with the first delivery scheduled for early February 2025. The company will be among the first in the Northeast to offer SAF for sale and plans to expand its supply as availability on the East Coast increases.

Several customers have already committed to purchasing SAF, which will also be available for transient aircraft. As production ramps up, Heritage Aviation anticipates a corresponding increase in SAF sales. The current formulation of SAF is a blend, with a long-term goal of transitioning to 100% SAF. While the most significant carbon reduction benefits presently lie in the production phase, further tailpipe emission reductions are expected as SAF advances toward full adoption. With the introduction of SAF, the company has phased out its "Heritage Green" carbon offset program, allowing customers to instead purchase SAF directly to claim carbon offset credits.

In addition to fuel innovation, Heritage Aviation is collaborating with BETA Technologies electric aircraft manufacturer based on the same airfield provide charging infrastructure for electric aircraft and vehicles as these technologies become commercially viable. Furthermore, the company has initiated early-stage discussions with a local solar energy firm, also a tenant, to explore options for expanding on-site solar capacity.
