The University currently holds and has held institutional accreditation with WASC Senior College and University Commission (WSCUC) since 2014. The University also holds programmatic accreditation with CAPTE (physical therapy), ACOTE (occupational therapy), CAA (speech-language pathology), ARC-PA (physician assistant), CCNE (nursing), ANCC (nursing), and IACET (continuing education). In April 2019 CAPTE placed the accredited DPT and DPT flex programs offered from the Austin campus on probationary status, citing non-compliance with a portion of one standard requiring 50% of core faculty to be doctorally prepared. The citation was not an indication of the quality of the University's faculty or faculty-to-student ratios; it resulted from a gap of two faculty without a PhD, EdD, or other terminal academic degree. This probation did not impact the programs' accreditation or WASC institutional accreditation nor did it impact access to financial aid or preparation for licensure for the students. The University and the Austin DPT programs immediately implemented a hiring and development plan to return to full compliance with CAPTE standards prior to the next compliance reporting date. CAPTE removed probation and continued accreditation at its next meeting in October 2019. The University and each of its accredited programs remain in good standing with its accrediting bodies at this time.

In the past five years, the University has had a limited number of legal matters. It has responded to six administrative agency complaints filed by students or employees asserting some form of discrimination or regulatory violation. All of these were dismissed without findings against the University. During this time period, there have been four litigation matters involving matters such as alleged breach of contract, failure to accommodate, discrimination and/or negligence, which were either dismissed or resolved for non-material amounts. There is one on-going litigation matter involving a former employee who is pursuing a claim of discrimination relating to his termination of employment in 2019. Finally, as disclosed in the prior recertification process, there was a group of several cases brought by former students more than five years ago concerning a program that was last offered by the University more than eight years ago. All those cases were resolved by the University's prior owner by spring 2019.
