SUMMARY OF ISSUE	As a brewery, 4 Pines Brewing operates in an industry that is water intensive.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the previous fiscaly year, >95% of revenue was earned from the sale of alcohol
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	As a water intensive industry, brewing poses risks such as water stress or depletion of local water sources if water use is not appropriately managed. 4 Pines Brewing Company sources its water from the Sydney Water Corporation and manages wastewater through its discharge agreement with Sydney Water Corporation.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	The company uses on average approx 4L of water per Litre of beer produced. They routinely benchmark themselves against industry partners within their network and share learnings to help improve this KPI. The company aims to reduce water usage 5% from the previous year. Lots of work has been done in this space through extract loss (beer loss) recovery and CIP (cleaning in place) management to recover and reuse water on site.

TOPIC	Recall of seltzer product
SUMMARY OF ISSUE	Cans of Brookvale Union Seltzer, produced from 1st of December, 2020 to the end of January 2021 developed high pressure internally, and often 'bulged' vertically in warehouse and/or trade. It has been well established through microbiological, alcohol, specific gravity and carbonation data that the bulging is caused by fermentation of the sugar and juice within the product.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Approx 53,000 cases were affected with approx 6,000 withdrawn from wholesale customers; the value of this recall represented AUD ~1,000,000 in value
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	The defect posed no health or safety risk to consumers and 4 Pines chose to recall the stock due to quality issues.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	The company no longer contract packs with the supplier that had produced this product on behalf of 4 Pines and the product has been discontinued. All Brookvale Union SKUs now use sodium benzoate as a preservative or are pasteurized, and stability of each batch is validated with microbial testing.
