Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Industries at risk for human rights violations

Topic	Company sources precious metals and gemstones
Summary of Issue	ID Genève is a Switzerland-based watchmaking company that uses refurbished or recycled and/or environmentally friendly input materials in their products and packaging. ID Genève does not purchase nor use any mined precious metals or stones.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	 0% of the company's raw material inputs are mined precious metals or stones. 100% of the ID Genève revenue comes from the sale of products made from environmentally friendly raw materials. Around 77% of the company's suppliers have officially signed the Supplier Code of Conduct.
Impact on Stakeholders	The use of precious metals and gemstones poses a human rights risk due to the possibility that they are sourced from conflict-affected and high-risk areas, where they may be used to finance conflict and/or be associated with human rights abuses in the supply chain. B Lab has flagged the jewelry industry as a material issue and new standards will be created to address possible risks related to this matter. Should the Standards Advisory Council determine specific performance requirements for companies in this industry, ID Genène would be required to meet these standards by a future recertification date.
Implemented Management Practices	 ID Genève has implemented the following practices to mitigate the risks associated with the watch-making industry: Uses 100% stainless steel from the Jura Region in France. The dials used by the company are produced in Switzerland using 80% recycled Brath with 100% recycled superluminova. Mechanical Movements used are certified and refurbished and sourced from old stocks in Switzerland; materials the company brought back into circulation. The straps used are made using eco-Cork produced in Portugal, Wine residue from Italy, Green Waste from London



parks. All of the packaging used by the company is home compostable, made by 2 European startups using Magical Mushroom for Mycelium and Notpla for Seaweed; nutrients to grow the packaging also have European origins. ID Genève has a Supplier Code of Conduct and requests that every supplier provides a transparent supply chain (including the sourcing of raw materials and certifications regarding materials/components). Information on the company's suppliers is available on their website (links below). The Company's Supplier Code of Conduct covers the following topics: 1. Legal Compliance: all suppliers must abide by the local legislation, especially related to Commercial transactions, Anti-trust, Anti-corruption, and anti-money laundering 2. Business Practices and Ethics: be transparent, report all information, conflicts of interest, 3. Human Rights and Fair Business Practices: suppliers must fully comply with labor laws, respect all human rights (do not discriminate, prohibit the use of forced labor and human trafficking, make sure workers have access to work-related documents, specify the terms and conditions of employment at the time of hiring, offer fair compensation, provide a safe and healthy working environment, meet requirements for days of work and days off, provide grievance procedures, guarantee freedom of association and collecting bargaining), 4. Environmental compliance: Suppliers must comply with local environmental laws and regulations, 5. Training on the supplier code of conduct: suppliers must ensure that their employees and approved contractors comply with this code, 6. Problems and reporting questionable behaviors: ID Genéve offers a channel so stakeholders anonymously share their concerns about a possible violation of the code.
