

DISCLOSURE MATERIALS

Certified B Corporations must complete a Disclosure Questionnaire to identify potentially sensitive issues related to the company (e.g. historical fines, sanctions, material litigation, or sensitive industry practices).

This component does not affect the company's score on the B Impact Assessment. If the company answers affirmatively to any items in the Disclosure Questionnaire and B Lab deems them to be material, the company must:

- 1) Be transparent about the disclosure issues identified on the company's public B Impact Report
- 2) Describe how the company has addressed this issue.
- 3) Demonstrate that management systems are in place to avoid similar issues from arising in the future.

Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

MPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	In all cases the supplier must have either a chain of custody certification or be an approved vendor from these ranking and certification schemes for the company to purchase from them. The company is audited by Marine Stewardship Council and OceanWise on an annual basis which require updated certifications and audits from all of their suppliers. Each supplier must provide them with an annual updated Chain of Custody certification. They also reserve the right to conduct in person audits should they believe the certifications supplied do not meet their requirements. Their Supplier Code of Conduct is applicable to all suppliers. The Code outlines requirements related to Child Labour, Forced Labour, Employment Contracts, Freedom of Movement & Personal Freedom, Documentation, Recruitment, Harassment & Abuse, Non-Discrimination, Freedom of Association, Grievance Procedures, Wages, Working Hours, Healthy & Safety, and the Environment.
	The company does not have any KPIs related to animal welfare, however they do publicly list the sustainability ranking of their products. They support one open net pen that raises Sablefish which are native to the environment (which minimizes issues surround escapement). The same farm is in an economic and employment partnership with the local first nation group that occupy and steward the land where the farm is situated. They also support land-based farms that are demonstrated to ethically raise fish without the use of chemicals, coloring agents, or harmful materials, and have received an ecological certification.
	While the company does not source much seafood outside of Canada and the United States, they recognize the potential forced labour and human rights risk of sourcing seafood from other countries. They regularly reference the US Bureau of International Labour Affairs (ILAB) for all at risk countries associated with human rights or exploitative labour. There are currently 14 countries and areas that are at high risk.
	 The company states the following: They source, purchase, and promote products that meet their sustainability criteria. Additionally, they will selectively work with those fisheries and aquaculture projects that do not meet current sustainability criteria to help assist these groups in improving their sustainability performance. They work with their fishers and supplier partners to improve and provide complete, detailed, and transparent seafood product traceability information for their customers. They openly collect and share current and relevant information regarding their sustainability practices with their customers, employees, supplier partners, and the public. They educate their employees, fishers, harvesters, producers, partners, and customers on their guiding principles associated with sustainably sourced seafood products. They support initiatives that encourage and maintain the ocean's ability to provide us access to a healthy source of protein. They believe that this is fundamental in supporting food sovereignty to their nation and increasing Canadians' food security. They encourage policymakers to improve and develop laws and regulations that support the improvement of fisheries and aquaculture management and enforcement.
