Topic	Company serves clients in Controversial Industries
Summary of Issue	Clever Ghost is a UK-based graphic design service that offers its services to clients in controversial industries, such as for-profit higher education, fossil fuel (excluding coal and oil sand), and tax advisory services. Their services can also be sold to non-controversial industries.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	For the fiscal year 2023, the revenue generated from clients in controversial industries accounted for approximately 3.34% of the company's overall revenue: - 2.42% of the client revenue has been from clients in the For-profit higher education industry 0.92% of the client revenue has been from clients in the Fossil Fuel (others excluded coal and oil sand) industry. The company did not generate revenues during 2023 from clients in the tax advisory services.
Impact on Stakeholders	Companies that work with clients in controversial industries can indirectly increase the harmful impact to stakeholders by enabling business growth. Therefore, companies that work with clients in these industries should have practices in place to ensure that their impact is aimed at decreasing the negative impacts of the industry. B Lab has flagged the involvement of companies with clients in controversial industries as a material issue and new standards will be created to address possible risks related to this matter.
Implemented Management Practices	The company does not work with clients in the following sectors: Weapons & Defence, Pornography, Debt Collection, Coal or Oil, Companies at risk of Human Rights violations, Pyramid or Multi-Level Marketing Companies, Tobacco or Vaping, Illegal Products, or those subject to phase out. Other companies outside of that list are assessed on a case-by-case basis. The company performs a supplier/client pre-engagement check via a declaration form. This form seeks proof of Anti-Slavery & Bribery policies, certifications and accreditations, third-party certifications related to ESG (Environmental, Social, and Governance), environmental practices, employment practices, and industry disclosures for those red-line industries.



Management Comments

At Clever Ghost, we are committed to integrating the recommendations set out by BCorp into our practices. We have already implemented a comprehensive client screening policy that aligns with our values and ensures that we manage the risks associated with working with clients from potentially controversial industries. Our approach is thorough, involving a detailed decision framework for evaluating potential clients. This scoring system includes screening criteria such as the client's industry, ESG practices, potential negative impacts, and conducting background checks to address any stakeholder concerns.

In addition to these measures, we uphold the standards set out by the International Council of Design (ICoD) Code of Conduct. This commitment guides us in designing ethically, helping us avoid any practices that could be misleading, such as greenwashing or goodwashing. We are acutely aware of the dangers these practices pose, both in our operations and in the services we provide to our clients. To prevent them, we diligently review all public materials to ensure that any claims made are substantiated with concrete evidence of actual impact. We avoid the misuse of broad terms like "sustainable" or "eco-friendly" without clear and comprehensive backing. Our studio also ensures that claims related to specific services or product lines are accurate and do not overstate a company's overall mission or performance. Lastly, we are cautious about using long-term future commitments as justification for current "green" or "good" claims, ensuring that all statements made are truthful and reflective of present actions.

By implementing these practices and adhering to the ICoD Code of Conduct, we strive to not only meet but exceed the ethical standards expected of us. We work closely with our clients to ensure transparency and avoid any form of misleading representation. This approach allows us to uphold our moral responsibilities and deliver services that are genuinely aligned with our commitment to positive social and environmental impact.
