Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

B Lab's Public Complaints Process

Any party may submit a complaint about a current B Corp through B Lab's Public Complaint Process. Grounds for complaint include:

- Intentional misrepresentation of practices, policies, and/or claimed outcomes during the company's certification process
- 2) Breaches of the B Corp Community's core values as expressed in our Declaration of Interdependence

Торіс	The company sells cannabis-derived products	
Summary of Issue	Zorali is a company that sells a variety of outdoor apparel and accessories that earns a material amount of revenue from the sale of CBD products, i.e hemp hemp-infused yarns that are used to produce some of their collections with organic cotton blend.	
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the previous fiscal year, Zorali claims less than 1% of its revenue was earned from the sale of cannabis-derived products. Their hemp/organic cotton blend apparel is on some types of tees, shorts, socks, hats ,and caps.	
Impact on Stakeholders	Cannabis-related products are subject to controversy both because of their current and historic legal status around the world, as well as concerns about the potential harm that the products may cause. Current regulations governing the legality of cannabis-derived products are complex and vary widely by local jurisdiction.	
Implemented Management Practices	Zorali claims that they maintain compliance with Australian regulations, and it is highlighted in the link here: https://zorali.notion.site/Hemp-Products-f553a6f5bddf4473a40f 9f81b1422d50 As a summary, Zorali claims that under Australian regulations, they may import the following **products** into Australia without import permission under the PI Regulations: • Products contain hulled hemp seeds, derived from hemp, and/or hemp seed oil, provided that: ○ They do not contain another drug ○ They do not contain any part (or extracts) of the cannabis/hemp plant (excluding extracts made from the hemp seeds) ○ The total cannabidiol (CBD) content is **0.0075%*** (75 mg/kg) or less, and ○ The total tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) content is less **0.005%*** (50 mg/kg) or less.
