Disclosure Materials

Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

B Lab's Public Complaints Process

Any party may submit a complaint about a current B Corp through B Lab's Public Complaint Process. Grounds for complaint include:

- 1) Intentional misrepresentation of practices, policies, and/or claimed outcomes during the company's certification process
- 2) Breaches of the B Corp Community's core values as expressed in our Declaration of Interdependence

Торіс	Company sources recycled gold and silver, and lab-grown diamonds
Summary of Issue	Nabs and Babs is a company based in the United States that develops jewelry using gold, silver and lab-grow diamonds.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In 2022, the company spent 86% of its supplier costs on recycled gold-related products, 4% on diamonds, 2% on pearls, and 8% on other precious metals.
Impact on Stakeholders	The use of precious metals and gemstones poses a human rights risk due to the possibility that they are sourced from conflict-affected and high-risk areas, where they may be used to finance conflict and/or be associated with human rights abuses in the supply chain. B Lab has flagged the jewelry industry as a material issue and new standards will be created to address possible risks related
	to this matter. Should the Standards Advisory Council determine specific performance requirements for companies in this industry, Nabs and Babs would be required to meet these standards by a future recertification date.
Implemented Management Practices	The company reported the following practices to manage the jewelry industry risks flagged:
	 The company has a Supplier Code of Conduct in place (applicable and signed by all their suppliers) that establishes minimum expectations regarding social and environmental standards. The company's Code "defines the universal standards that we require our suppliers to adhere to when conducting business with us. The requirements laid out in the Code are based on internationally recognized standards, including the UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights, the UN Global Compact Principles, and the International Labour

	 Organisation (ILO) Declaration on Fundamental Rights and Principles at Work." The Code applies to all workers and employees of any of those suppliers (including permanent, temporary, contract agency, and migrant workers). The Code includes the following themes directly related to the jewelry industry-risks: Compliance with the law, Bribery/corruption, Traceability, materials and facility disclosure, Freely chosen employment, Child Labour and Young Workers, Freedom of Association and Collective Bargaining, Regular Employment Status, Wages and Benefits, Working Hours, Humane Treatment, Discrimination, Respect for Community Rights to Land, Health and Safety Environmental Sustainability.
	 2. Nabs and Babs also has a Supplier policy for Conflict Minerals that lists specific tasks to be carried out by the suppliers to ascertain that their goods are conflict-free. All its business partners, suppliers and service providers have a strong commitment to ethics and green initiatives. Not only this, we work closely with the Responsible Jewellery Council and we follow the United Nations seventeen sustainability goals.
	 The company does not have 3rd party social/environmental/ethical certification regarding its procurement of precious metals.
